Dear Sirs,

We are living in St. Gallen Switzerland and have observed on Tuesday 13th August somekind of a missile or satellite flying at a hight of approx. 15'000 to 18'000 feet. It was glowing and looked like a small fireball. Speed and hight have been constantly same and we wondered what this could be. The next evening, Wednesday 14th August we waited and at exactly the same time as the evening bevore this glowing ball raised again exactly at the same point over the mountains and flew with exactly the same speed but slightly lower in the same direction. The sky was slightly clouded but this flying object did not disappear behind the clouds. We estimated the flying hight at approx. 7'500 to 10'000 feet. After about 4 minutes it suddenly stoped glowing and we thought that it disappeared behind a cloudbank first, but after observing exactly with binoculars we would see a dark looking flying object and after about one minute we could see the glow again. After about 30 seconds then this small glow turned into a fairly big fireball about 5 times as bis as before. Glew for some seconds and suddenly fall apiece so that it looked as firework on festivals. The explosion took place at approx. 20.04 and we estimated that the glowing parts have fall to earth in the area of Toggenburg (western part, county St. Gall). This flying object did not appear in the sky on Thursday and we wonder whether you have some knowledge of a low flying satellite. In case that you can give us some information we would thank you in advance because there is already some silly talk about flying sources in our newspapers.
