1. The following information was forwarded by the SSD Command Post to SSF:

"This report was received in the SSD Command Post by TSgt Deehan at 1545 PDT, 3 September 1963. Report was received from Mr. James Shannon, 18th District OSI, Phone Angeles 81353.

"Mr. Shannon was contacted by a Mr. [REDACTED] North Ridge, California, home phone [REDACTED], business phone Dicken [REDACTED], extension [REDACTED], and a Mr. [REDACTED] whose business phone is [REDACTED] who both gave the following account.

"At 0440 to 0445 PDT on 1 September, both men observed a yellow and orange point of light travelling in a South to North direction. (Approximately 15 to 20 degrees West of North). Observation time was 2 to 3 minutes. The point of light had no sound and no tail. No estimate of speed or height other than it was faster than any aircraft they know about. There was no moon, sun, or haze. Observation took place in Niland, California."
