On February 21, 1964, from 5:16:30 P.M. to 5:17:30 P.M.*
I observed an unidentified flying object, do monitor,
elliptical and oval looking in form with varying light
on each side in the bottom. * (about 10 ft long)
The object itself wasn't visible to the naked eye,
but I found it quickly by looking between the flashes
of brilliant white light! These flashes didn't occur more
every second, or any consecutive, but sometimes they
order: flash (short), pause, flash (longer), pause, flash
pause, flash (longer), pause, flash (short) & didn't keep
track of those flashes because almost all absorbed in
observing the object. The time of the power also would
be checked my telescope as if it was in forward
at most. I checked the object for wings, dorsal and
vertical stabilizer, missiles, and any protruding surface
and found none. The object seemed to be surrounded by
a layer of shimmering air, which might indicate heat.
(A note about the fact, the object apparently didn't
change attitude during those flashes as could be observed
while watching the object while the flashes took place.)
The object remained in a dorsal attitude and appeared
not to have any changes in the size of pitch, roll or
yaw. No change or apparent gear were noted either direct
measured.

As the object moved the trees and the houses, at Toronto
Eight minutes later for about ten seconds before it was lost
from sight

The object seemed to be pursuing a WNW course at about a
degree second at between 5 and 10 degrees above the horizon
just as it turned right at approach to pursue a more

northwesterly course. It seemed to me that it moved north. Then south and then pursued the north-westerly course. It did this once, and very again, great as it turned out.

Since the distance to the object is unknown, its size and altitude can't be calculated.

I suspect didn't make any person aircraft. As I said before, it had no wings, had no body, no cells, or any visible engine prop or jet.

At (the object still) appeared to follow its course at a perfectly uniform speed. At no time did the object pulsate or throb.

It also seemed solid. It could not be through it. I saw pale orange lights on the bottom. Looked out portions of the object.

It gave it for about a total of 1 minute. It obtained

it from about 5:16:30 P.M. CST to 5:19:30 C.S.T.

"I don't put out it, it was about fifteen (15) degrees

east of North (or there as I can approximate) and between 5 and

10 degrees above the horizon. It disappeared 45° west of

North over the horizon. It could be seen through the

tree. The object could be seen only through a telescope or

binoculars and it wasn't visible to the naked eye.

My hobby for the past 10/14 years has been

collecting and I am thoroughly familiar with most aircraft.

4) Where were you when you saw the object?
I just saw the object. Through the north window
of our house, watching it for approximately five seconds,
we had a telescope, got my telescope, and observed the object
from our front yard.

5) Estimate how long you saw the object. 1 minute - (certain)

6) What was the condition of the sky? Bright Twilight

7) If you saw the object during daylight, twilight, or dawn

Only the moon was visible in the southern sky. (It was about 30° high)

Sound: No sound was heard.

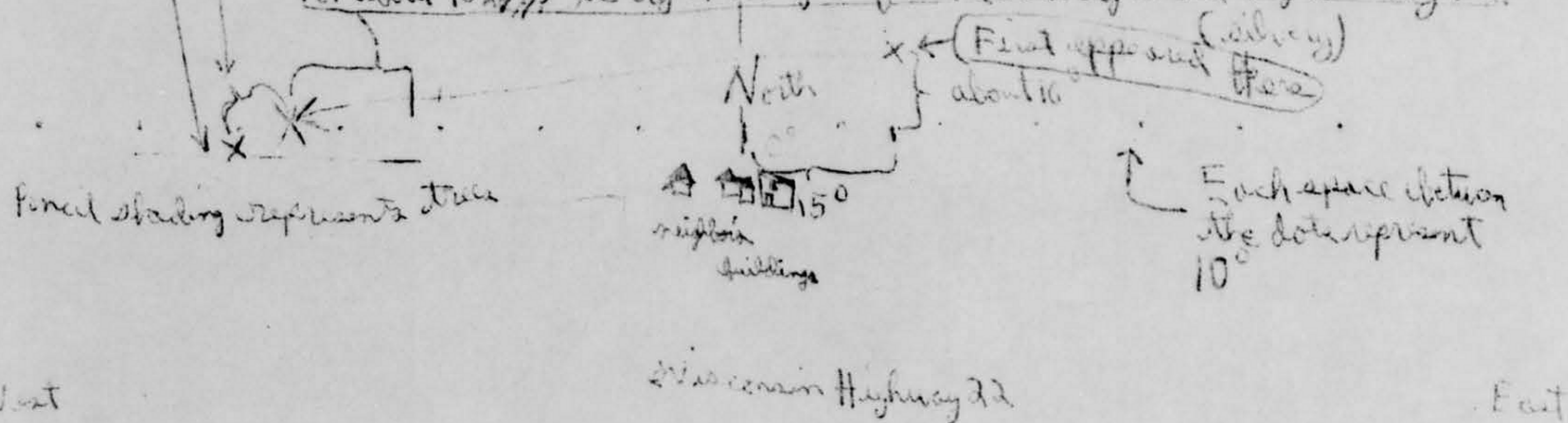
Color: The saucer was dark in color, except for the two orange lights, one on each side, on the bottom of the object.

15) Draw a picture, label and sketch and details

The line in the background represents the horizon.

For about this distance the new silvery object could be seen behind the trees.

For about 10 ~~seconds~~ the object changed from a dark object to a bright shiny one.



This view is based on a reference point in my front yard, the tree to be exact.

16) The edges of the object were: fuzzy or blurred, but they appeared solid.

Question is where the path that the object took

18) If possible, estimate age in feet.
How can it be accomplished because the distance and altitude
are unknown.

19) How large is the object compared with an object
held at arm's length.

The object could not be seen with the naked eye.
It could only be observed through a telescope. Very bright
flashes of white light which occurred alternately and
sometimes continuously were the only signs of the
unidentified flying object. The object
didn't seem to change altitude when these flashes occurred.

20) How did the object disappear from view?
The object passed behind some trees and then went
out of the horizon.

21) Describe its construction.

It was a dark white, shiny solid looking object with
two orange lights on the bottom, one on each side. It was
definitely elliptical, a "saucer" shaped object, that was one
would take two regular saucers and put them together.
one would then have a similar looking object. The object
was very sharp, but it looked solid and one of the wings
sticks on the bottom. About part of the object.*

22) Where were you when you saw the object?
The only place I saw the object itself was on our
front yard and only by means of a telescope.

* Did not see a light. Just a solid object.

23.) Were you in the open country? Yes

24.) What were you doing at the time you saw the object?
Just previous to seeing the object I was doing school work.
I happened to notice the object when my mother said an
airplane had just "flashed" in the northern sky and I went
to our upstairs window to take a look. I could see no
aircraft, but suddenly there was a bright metallic flash
(shiny) and I thought to myself an aircraft would have to be
making an extraordinary maneuver, possibly even disinte-
grating. At this time, I ran downstairs and out into our front
yard to observe through my telescope.

25.) What direction were you looking when you first saw the
object? I was looking approximately N by E.

26.) What direction were you looking when you last saw
the object? I was looking approximately northwest.

27.) When it first appeared:

A) From True North 15 degrees (East)
B) From Horizon about 10 degrees

When it disappeared:

A) From True North about 45 degrees (West)
B) From Horizon 0 degrees

28.) What were the weather conditions when you saw the
object? Clouds Wind Weather Temperature
a few clouds no wind dry cool

29.) Was anyone else with you at the time you saw the
object? Yes, my mother saw only the flashes but didn't
see the object directly.

30.) Was this the first time you had seen an object like this?

Yes it was, but in May of 1964, I saw three unidentified flying objects dissimilar to the one in February of that year.

31.) In your opinion what do you think caused or could have caused it?

In my opinion, I would classify this object as an unidentified flying object; its cause unknown.

32.) Can you estimate the speed or distance.

The distance is unknown; therefore so is the speed, size and altitude.
