The satellite you observed was Echo II, which passed over your area at the approximate time you quoted.

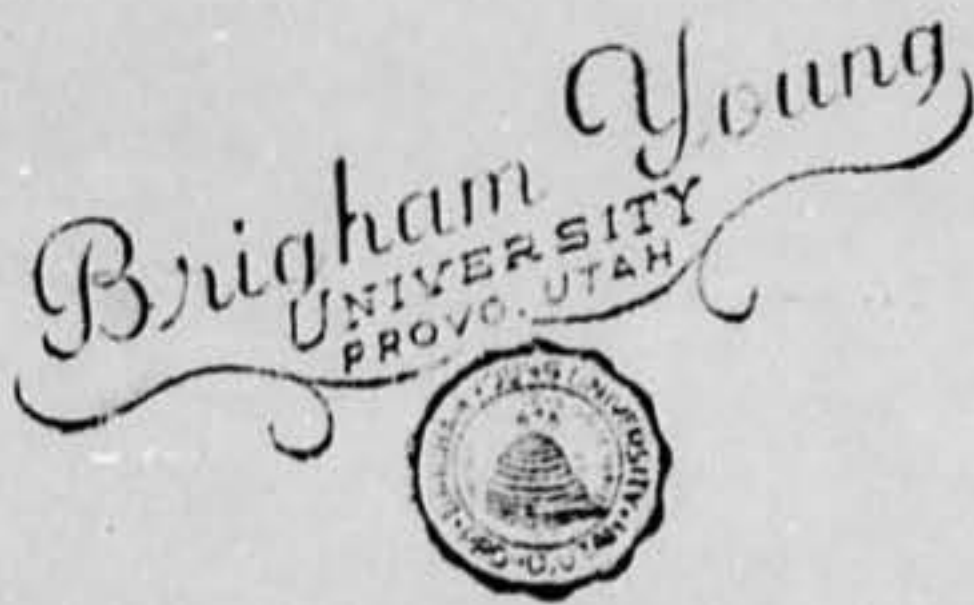
