At 9:15 PM, September 21, 1964, Mr. [REDACTED], [REDACTED], Berea, Ohio, telephone [REDACTED], telephonically contacted this office and furnished the following information.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated that at 9:11 PM, September 21, 1964, he and his wife saw an unidentified flying object traveling from the southeast to the northwest at a terrific rate of speed. He described the unidentified flying object as a very bright light flashing on and off but without a visible shape and it was almost blinding to the eye. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that anyone outside looking up at the sky would have seen this light.

The above is being submitted for such action as you deem appropriate and no investigation is being conducted by this office.
