SUBJECT: Unidentified Flying Object Sighting

23 November 1964

TO: FTD (TDE)

1. At approximately 1540 hours, 17 November 1964, Mrs. [REDACTED], [REDACTED], Cleveland, Ohio, reported that her son, [REDACTED], had come home from school and reported that during lunch break at [REDACTED] Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, many of the children in the playground had seen a circular object flying overhead with two appendages sticking out from the bottom. One of the boys, [REDACTED] of [REDACTED], Cleveland, Ohio, drew the object on a blackboard in the school during a subsequent class. All the children involved were from ten to twelve years old. The incident occurred sometime during the period 1230 to 1240 hours, 17 November 1964.
