AIRCRAFT UNDER THEIR OPERATIONAL CONTROL BUT THEIR POSITION WAS APPROXIMATELY 1000 MILES SOUTH-SOUTHEAST OF THE SIGHTINGS. AN AN/FPS-6 HEIGHT FINDER RADAR WAS OPERATED IN THE MANUAL MODE FOR A PERIOD OF 30 MINUTES TO "SEARCHLIGHT" THE AREA OF THE SIGHTINGS. NO ABNORMAL AIRBORNE OBJECTS WERE OBSERVED AS A RESULT OF THIS OPERATION. DUE TO A LACK OF MATERIAL, NO ANALYSIS OF THE REPORTED INFORMATION WAS ATTEMPTED AND NO CONCLUSIONS MADE.
