Seen first through bedroom window and thought to be a star, however it started to move. Observed at 80 deg elevation in NE. Disappeared on same angle above the horizon. Moved toward the SE and also appeared to move in a lateral direction and slight (2 deg) movements. Disappeared slowly by growing smaller, still in sight after 1 hour and 15 minutes. Reported disappearance occurred during interview with the witness by the investigating official. COMMENTS: Object observed through window, yet reported at 80 deg elevation. Likely that the elevations was somewhat lower. ARCTURUS was at 45 deg elevation in East and the only major astro body near the reported area. Sighting characteristics of an astro body observation. Motion attributed to illusions.

K. CAPT ROBERT E. RAYNOR, JR., BASE OPERATIONS DUTY OFFICER.

A CALL WAS RECEIVED FROM A SGT HANKS, VIRGINIA STATE POLICE,

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TO WHOM MR. [REDACTED] INITIALLY REPORTED HIS SIGHTING. PRIOR TO CONTACTING MR. [REDACTED] THE DUTY OFFICER ATTEMPTED TO DETERMINE IF A WEATHER BALLOON HAD BEEN RELEASED, WITH AFFIRMATIVE RESULTS. DURING THE PERIOD OF CONTACT WITH MR. [REDACTED] THE DUTY OFFICER MADE SEVERAL ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE THE OBJECT, AT THE OBSERVERS REQUEST, BUT COULD NOT SIGHT IT. CONTACT WAS THEN MADE WITH NORAD SPADET, WHO ASSERTED THAT NO VISIBLE SATELLITES WERE IN THIS AREA. MR. [REDACTED] SOUNDED RELIABLE AND THOUGH HE DID NOT AGREE, IT IS VERY POSSIBLE THAT THE SIGHTING WAS OF THE WEATHER BALLOON RELEASED AT WASHINGTON AIRPORT. AT THE VERY END OF THE CONVERSATION MR. [REDACTED] REPORTED THE DISAPPEARANCE OF THE OBJECT.
