Gentlemen,

The following data may be of some interest to the Air Force
Defense Command not so much from another sighting but the kind
of sighting.

I wish to report a craft maneuvering last night at 8:10 P.M. .
E.S.T. from my small farm at [REDACTED], Ohio
Summit County, Norton Twp.

The craft appeared a half minute after a high flying jet plane(
looked by exhaust and sound to be an intercept air force plane
flying west about 45,000 ft. altitude and just under the sound
barrier perhaps about 700 M.P.H.) was observed by this writer.

Judged height of circular craft 150,000 to 200,000 ft. altitude
bearing S. 30 Deg. W. and on vertical angle of 70 deg. Judged
speed very great and very graceful and very constant lasting
1 1/2 seconds. Later in my study the altitude, time of flight
and angle of closure calculations came out to 13 m.p. second or
780 m. p. minute or 46,800 M.P.H.

The most valuable part of the sighting was that this craft flew
in a very particular flight pattern(much the same as an earth
man would fly it). It came down in a vertical dive culminating
in a long corkscrew downward spiral and then maneuvered into an
upward corkscrew turn and voloplaned to two distinct levels,
each level appearing to be about 10,000 feet altitude. It glowed
from weak to intense as power was applied at the various stages
of decent and ascent and level changes and the craft emitted a
different type of output of glow from anything I saw on TV on
UFO's or had read about it in last 12 years. The light was a
clear silvery white COOL type of light emission changing only in
intensity but NOT IN COLOR.
