Dear Sirs:

At about five to seven, [REDACTED] evening (Central Standard Time) [REDACTED], age 14, who lives at [REDACTED] walked out of his house and saw [REDACTED] saw a cigar-shaped object to the E.N.E. (East north east) at a sixty degree angle. We show in the following a drawing of the object:

The object was of whitish silver in color and about 30 to 40 feet in length at what we could tell at its altitude which in [REDACTED]'s opinion was close to a thousand feet. The width (width) was from 15 to 20 feet from what we could tell. altitude

The speed of the object is unknown, depending on the speed of the object, but is guessed to be about one hundred miles an hour. The object hovered, then jerked and then sped away in an easterly at about a thousand miles an hour.

Mike then came to my house where he showed me the object. The object was slowly moving in a southerly direction at about one hundred miles per hour, and twenty degrees above the horizon. The object disappeared after about two minutes just below the roofline of a house across the street.

We ran to the corner which took about ten seconds to again see the object. The object had disappeared completely from sight. Just before it went behind of the roof line of the house mentioned, the object hovered, dropped a few degrees and gained speed rapidly. There was no sound connected with the object.

[REDACTED] and I, [REDACTED] age 14, address [REDACTED], are both Boy Scouts in Troop 73 of Richardson and we give you our scout's honor that this is not a hoax or optical illusion. The sky was clear and there was a stiff south easterly wind. We believe it is not a weather balloon because of the wind direction and the size and shape.

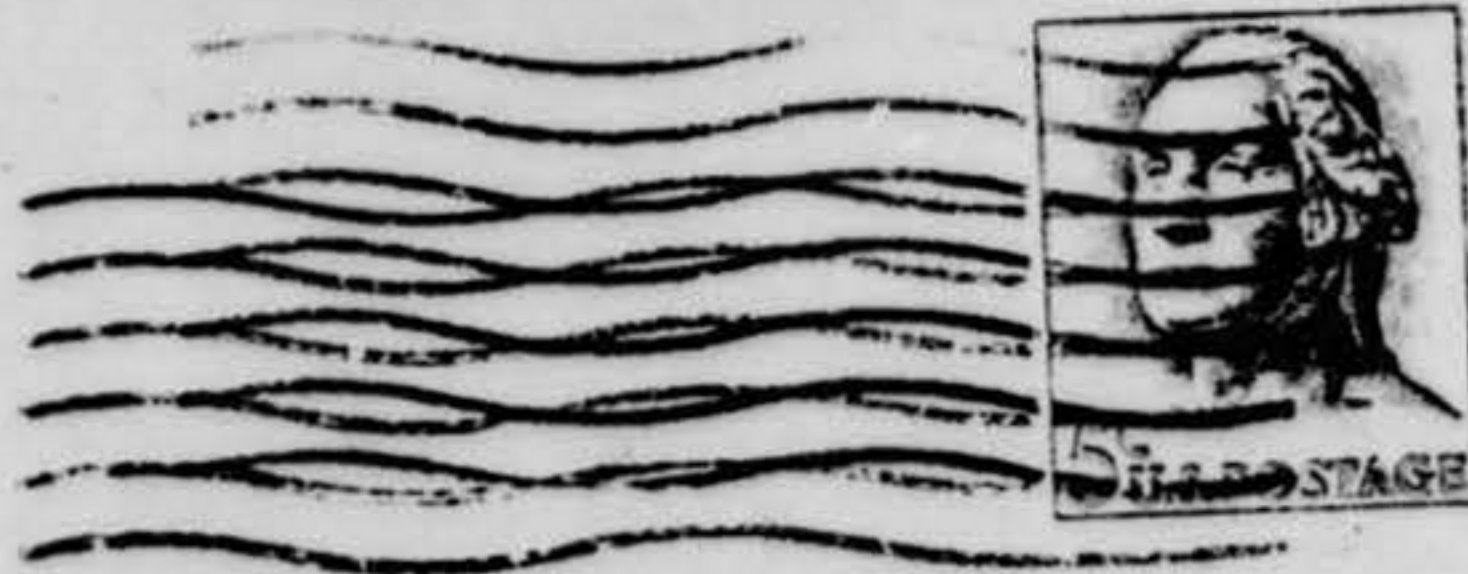
