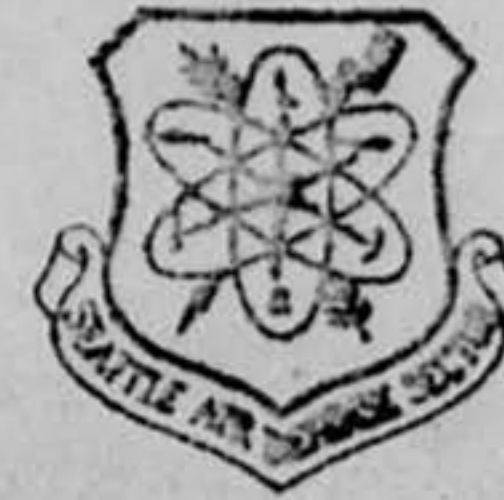

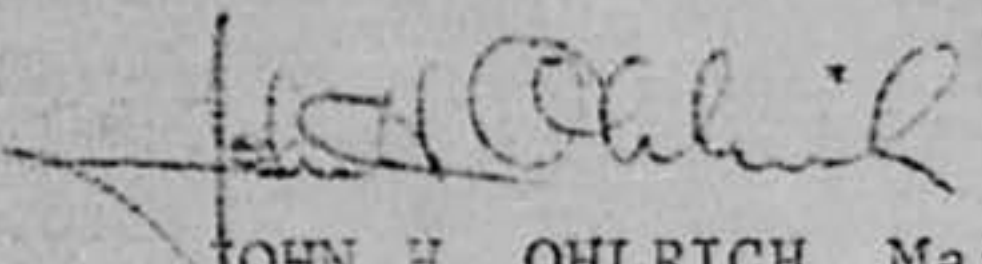

Dear Sir:

I will begin by saying that I do NOT believe in "flying saucers" or little green men from other planets spying on us. However, I do have complete confidence in the fact that our government, as well as Russia, has put numerous satellites up in the sky and that these are visible from time to time. My only question now is confirmation of my sighting one and which of the many I may have seen.

On Friday evening, July 30, between 11:00 and 11:15 p. m. I was driving home and saw a lighted, moving object moving due south at about 45 degrees up in the sky. I went in the house and called for my wife to come out and see it and we watched it move rapidly in a line to the south. It alternately changed from red to yellow-ish orange. It was not a plane as a plane's lights will not flash in the manner that this did. I attribute this changing of lights to the tumbling action of the satellite.

I may be slightly off in my estimation of the time but I am wondering you have any information regarding a flight of a satellite at approximately that hour.
