of Waldport, Oregon on the night of Aug. 4, 1965.
Some time between 10 and 10:20 P.M. P.D.T., we
observed high overhead, U.F.O. similar to a bright star
moving in a broken line with varying intensity.
It moved thru (+) or (-) 5° arc under our observa-
tion. The U. F. O. was observable for approximately
15 seconds. May we have Air Force identification
or evaluation of said unidentified flying object?
