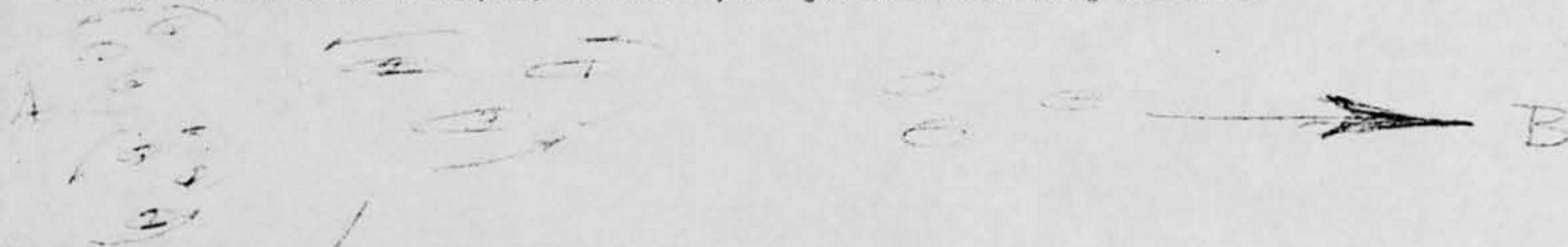

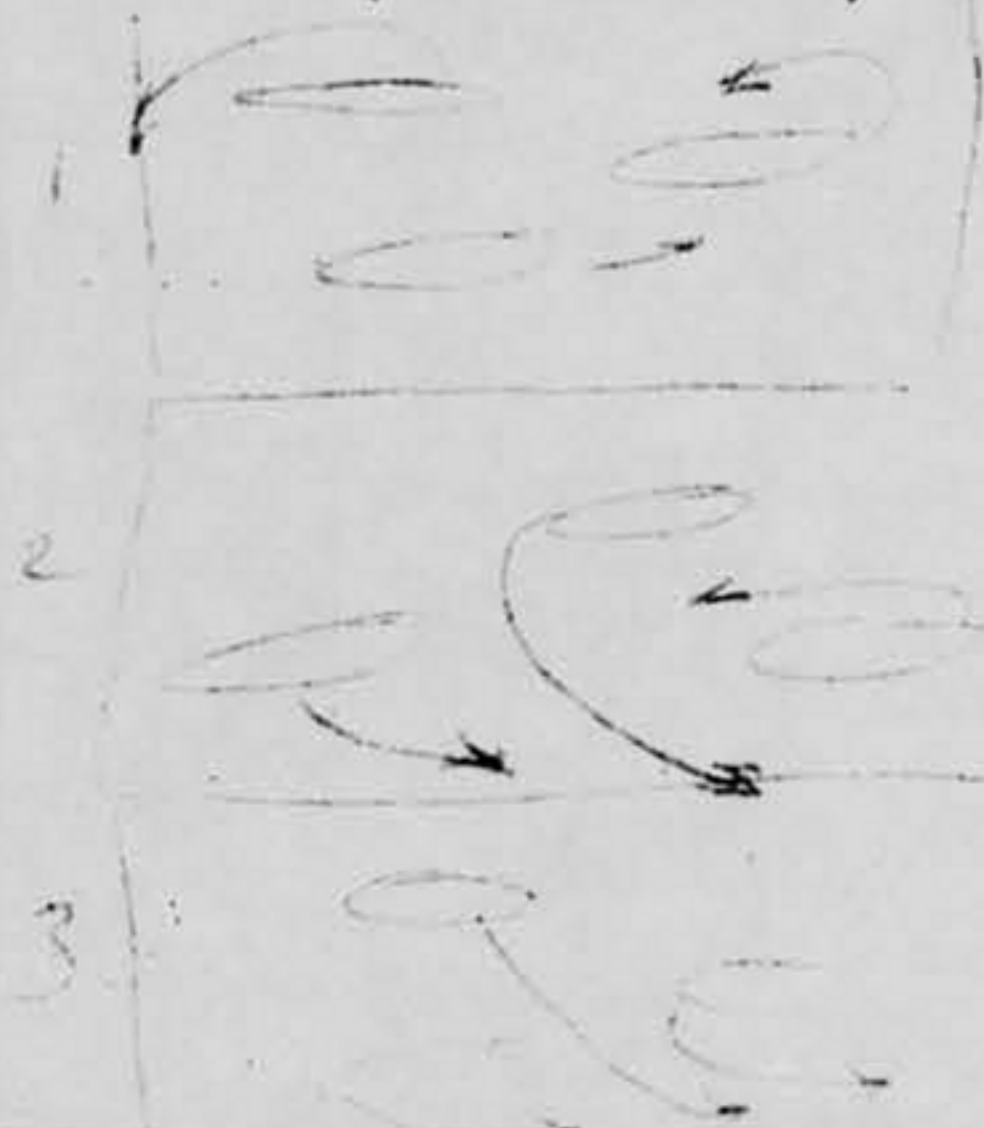

It would like to report that on August 21, 1945 at 10:00 AM on U.S. Route 1
10 miles north of Danbury Connecticut
there were unidentified flying objects were sighted.
They were circular (saucer shaped) - however
but rather fuzzy which made it impossible
to estimate size or height. They seemed
to be playing some sort of game for
they were darting around in circles -
crossing each other paths for about
10 minutes. Then, as if by signal they took
off at great speed and were almost
instantly out of sight. This phenomena
was witnessed by four other reputable
people who can verify this report.
Believe me this was no mistake or
information - it was very real. I don't know
