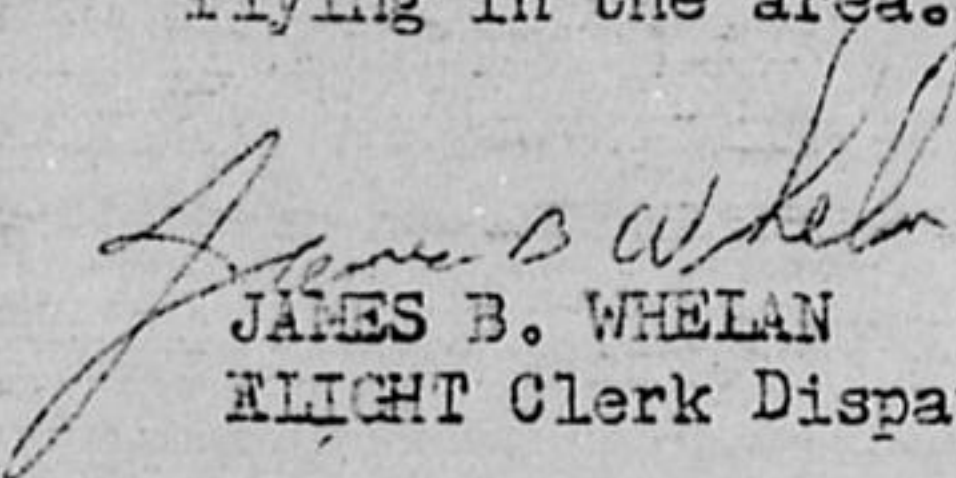

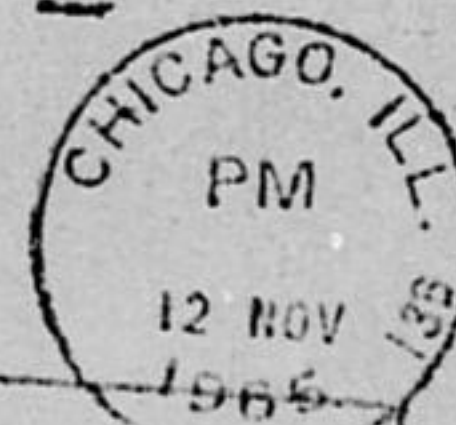

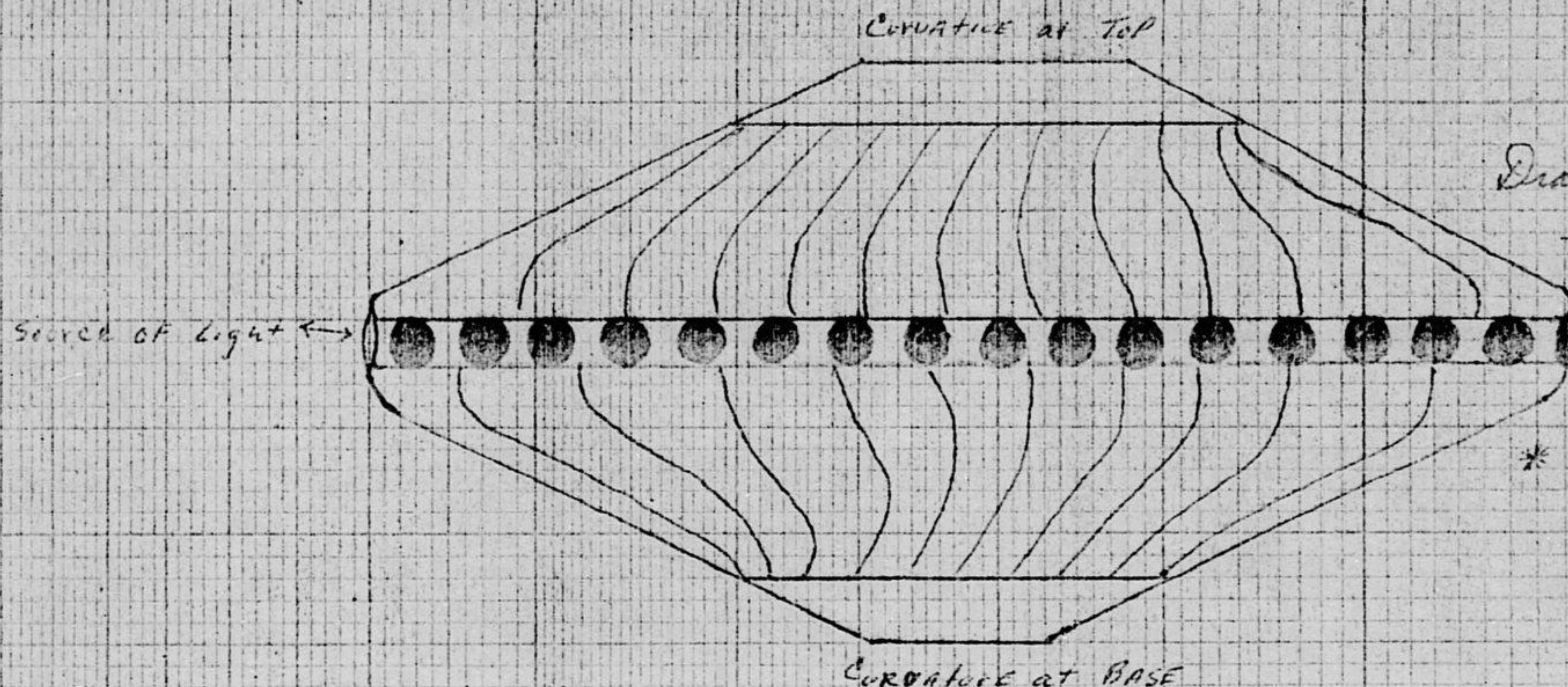

witnesses to this.

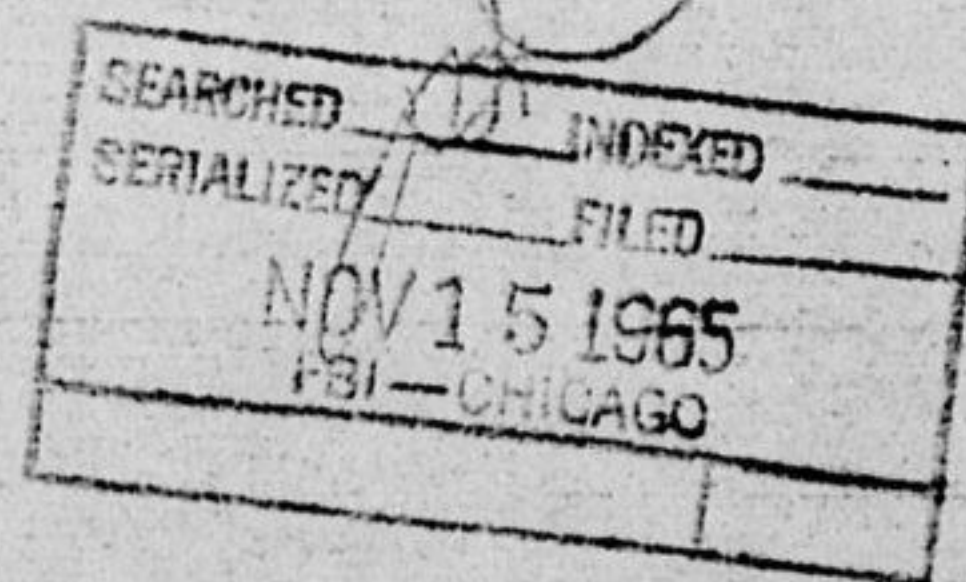

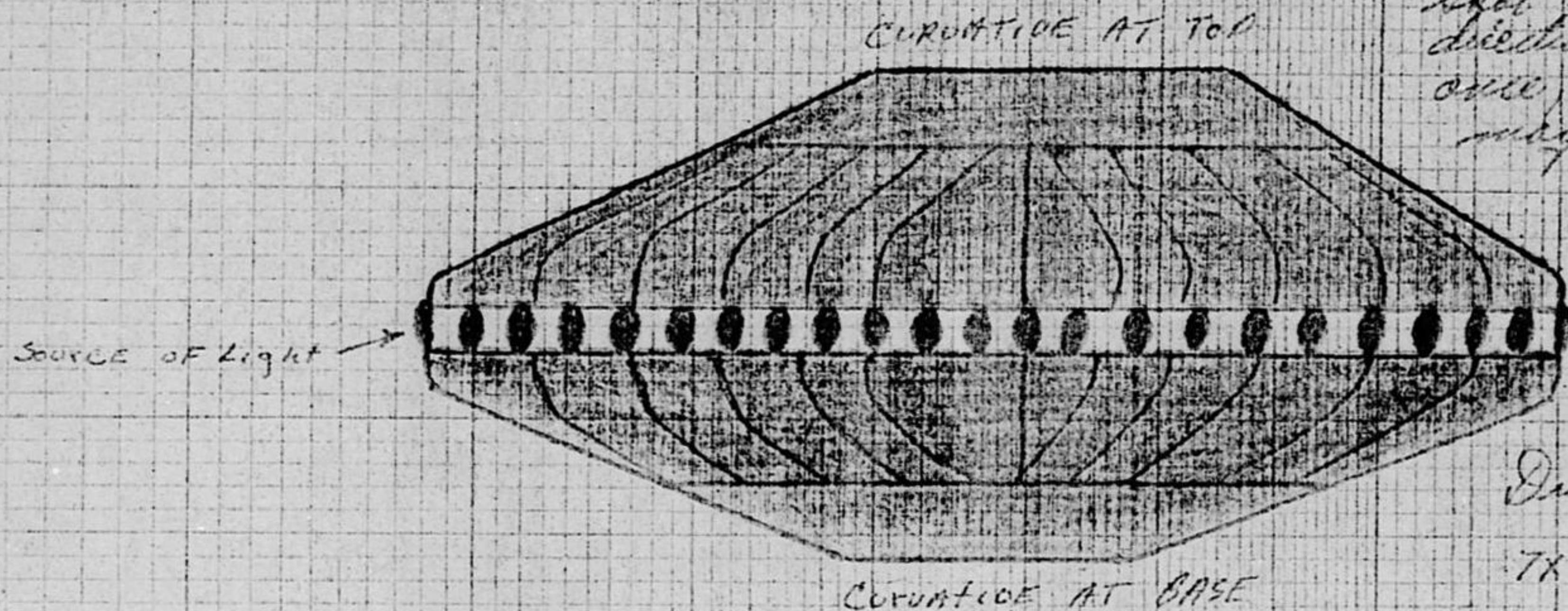

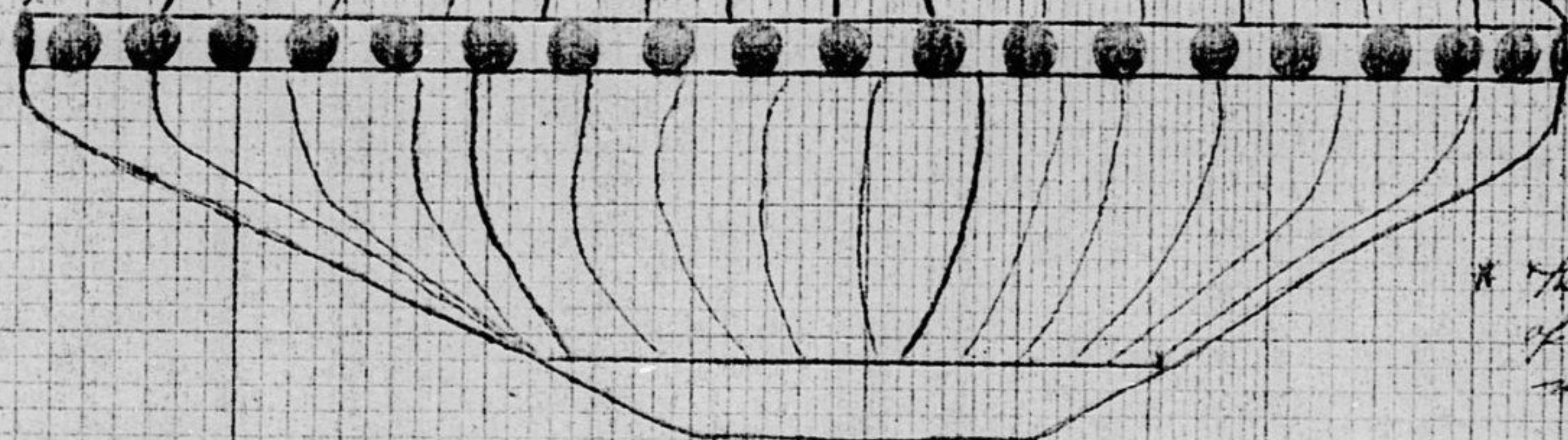
