Some time in the fore part of the month of January 1966 (Date is not sure to me but the time of occurrence is definite), at 6:00 A.M. there was a bright blue flash out east. I noticed the flash as did my Wife.

I was eating breakfast on a Sat. morning. At about 20 or 22 minutes after 6 I went out as I was puzzled by the interference sound in the radio. It was not static.

There was a series or group of light coherent not incident I believe up high nearly vertical beside a large Fir tree.

I rushed in and got a pair of Sanyo 7x50 glasses they have rubber

eye cups and proceeded to eye
ball this device.

I could never discern any air
frame or form of structure. It
just kept going up and up.

I do know there was nothing
wrong with me my sight with
glasses.

This was a clear cloudless Sat,
morning.

There was a jet up there I could
see the fuselage of jet Sun com-
ing up. Jet was traveling nearly
straight north out of sound so
high.

When this device stopped going
nearly straight up it went nearly
straight south. I could never see
anything other than odd flames or
lights.

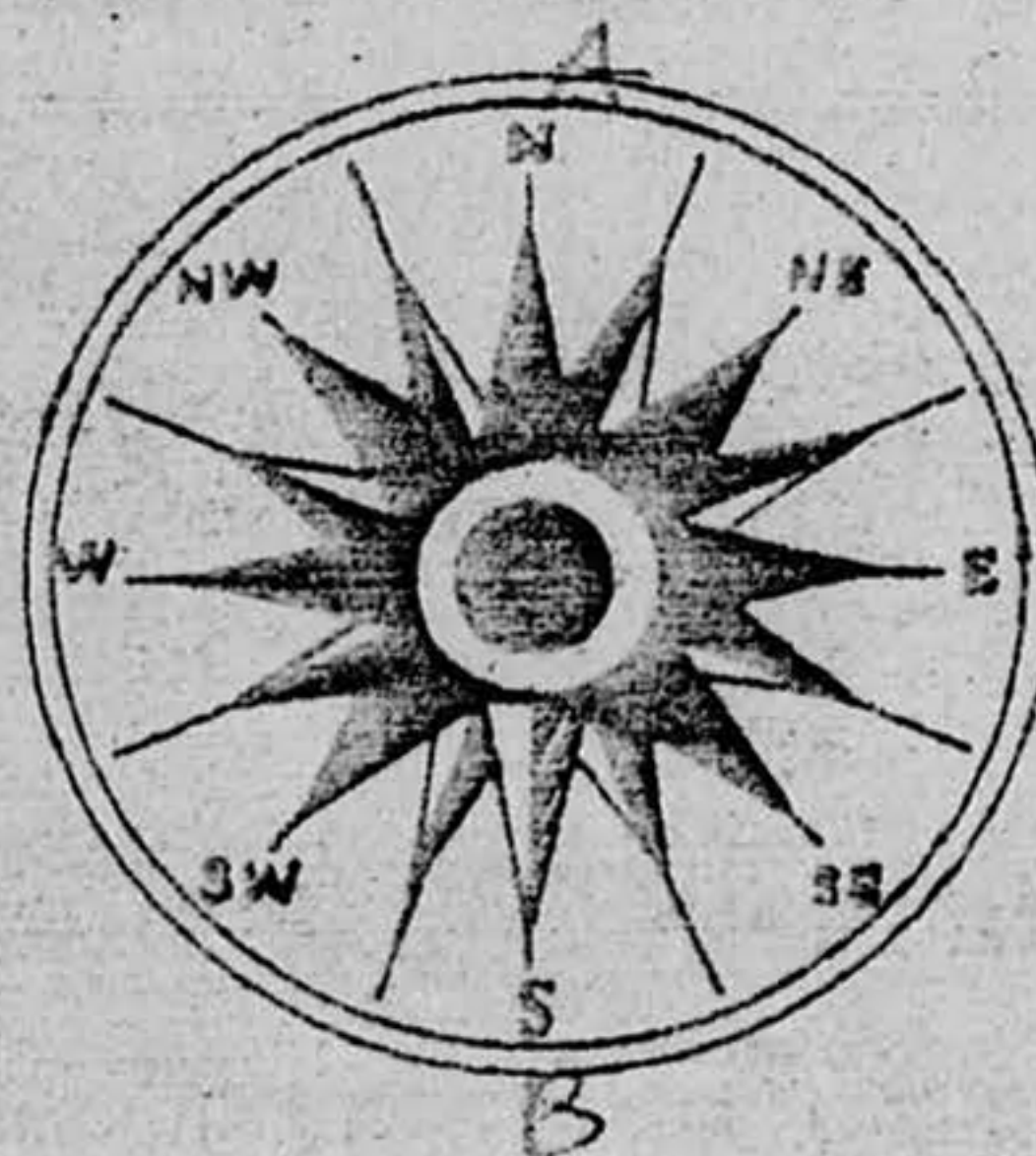
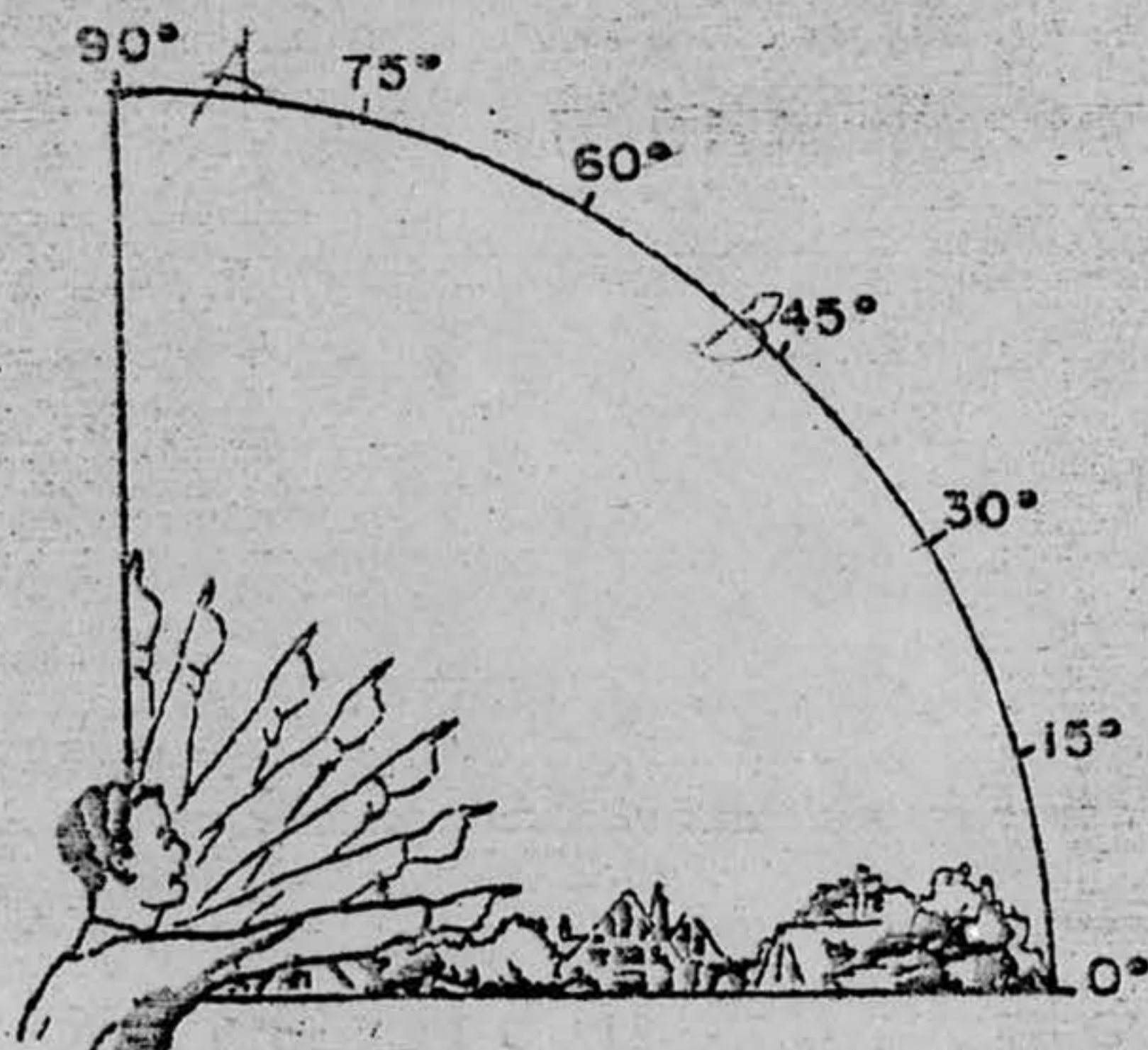
