Object had a ring or hoop extending out 8 to 10 inches around the center horizontal. It had a 5 to 6 ft hatch located on the bottom. Sounded like a turbine engine and the order of sulfur or rotten eggs was present. Observer also stated that his watch stopped at 1527 CST. He saw the object for 1-2 minutes while it hovered 5 feet above the ground and 20 ft from the observer. Then it accelerated and disappeared in a few seconds. The object also had a cone on top 8-10 inches high with a blinking green light.

12 January 66

Received a call from Bookley Air Force Base, Alabama. FAA had nothing in the air below 1800 feet. Navy did not have any aircraft in the area. Highway 63 is not heavily traveled. There is no house within 1 mile of the place where the boy saw this object. There was no dried grass on either side of the highway. The object went away from the sun.
