Observer states that since the establishment of beacons at Auburn and Augusta he had seen the lights several times before he realized that they were actually ships from Mars. I got the idea that the observer was actually poking fun at other people who had seen these lights in the area rather than making a report.

Gentlemen:

On Tuesday evening, March 22, 1966, my daughter and myself observed what I believe to be the same flying saucer lights which were widely reported in the Witchfield, Gardiner, and Richmond area.

My House is located on the northern outskirts of Richmond village and we had a good opportunity to observe the lights which appeared to our left, crossed toward our right disappeared, and reappeared again on our left.

We also observed that each of these two lights had a very definite period much like the air beacons at Augusta and Auburn, also that each light had a very faint, thin tail which was anchored, one almost due west of us, the other almost due North, the directions of Auburn and Augusta respectively.

Since the establishment of various beacons in this area (about thirty years) I have often observed similar lights without realizing that they were ships from Mars.
