7. It went from horizon to horizon

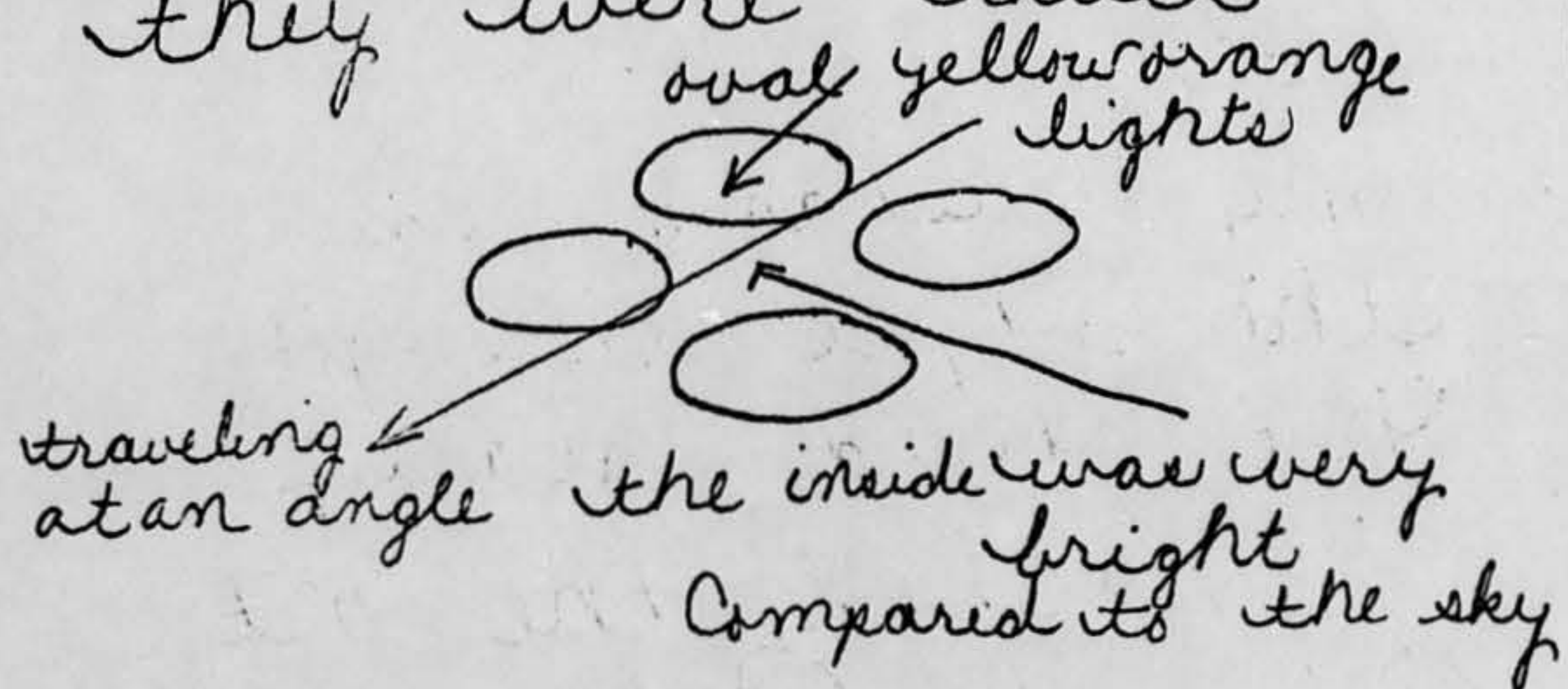
