This was something of an eerie sighting. I have no idea what it was except it frightened me. I got up at 3 AM to get a drink of water and was standing at the kitchen sink looking out. It was moonlight and this was in some view screen the moonlight. The curtain hid all of it but from what I saw I would say it was from 12-20 feet off the ground and about 10 by 10 feet in depth. It was "homing" near my fireplace. All of a sudden it went in a streak so fast I couldn't see it move but it had appeared or sparks to go into the ground a point of 20 feet or so (this was spinning all the time at fast speed when I saw it.) After that for a week or so I had the feeling I was being watched thru an uncurtained window. During this time of that particular week I also saw something funny. A bright light appeared to come in my bedroom window. No car was around and the moon I don't know if it was out or not but it was not that bright. Also saw two objects that week move across the horizon looked like bright stars. They were going from South to North at a slow speed. They kept an even space between them and high up. One seemed to start up. They moved slowly across the horizon.

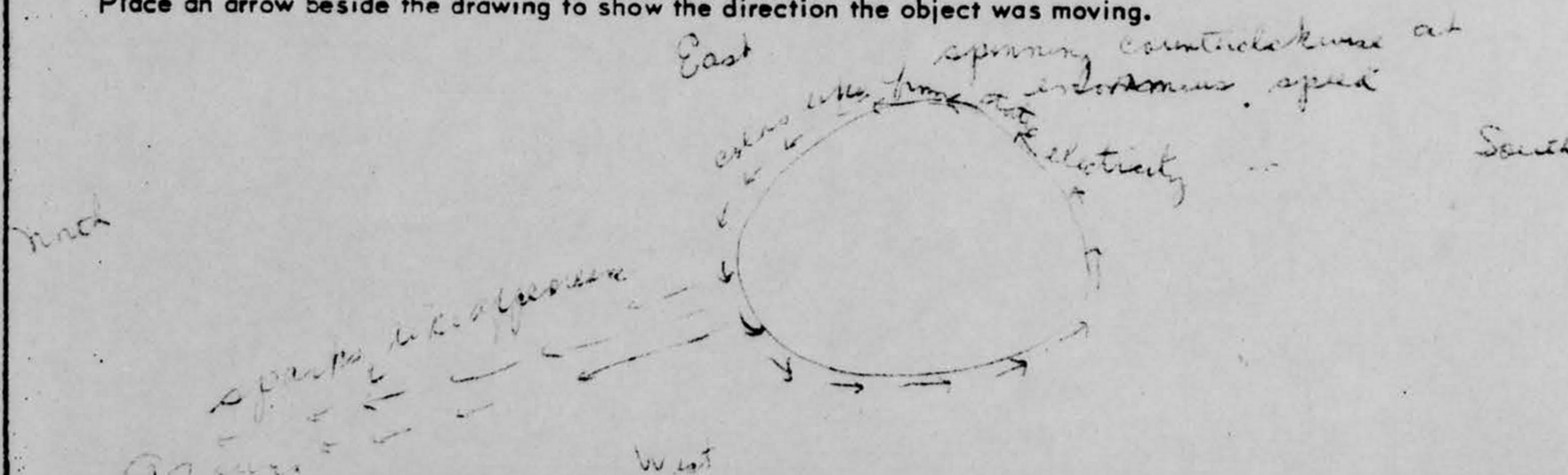

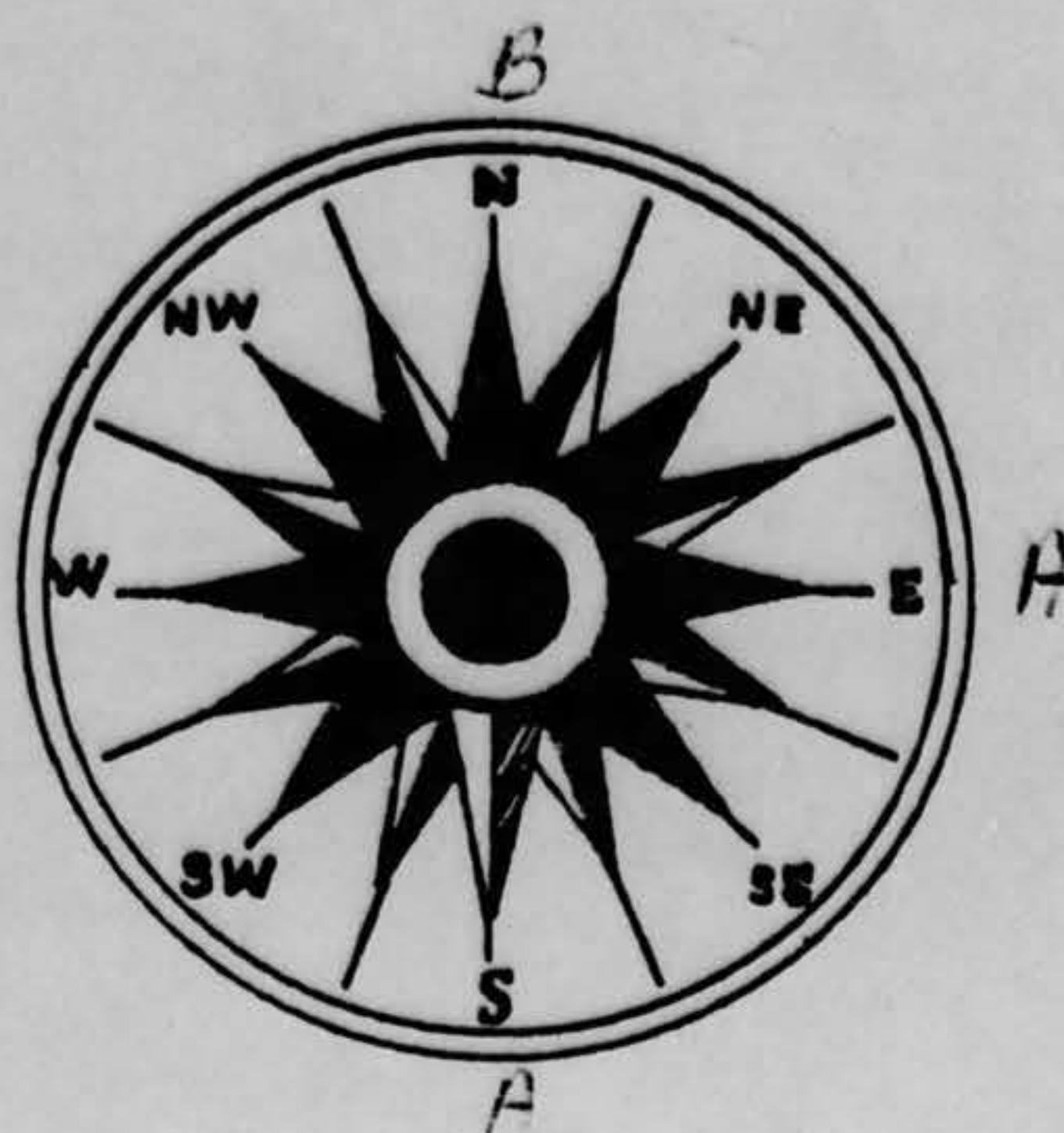
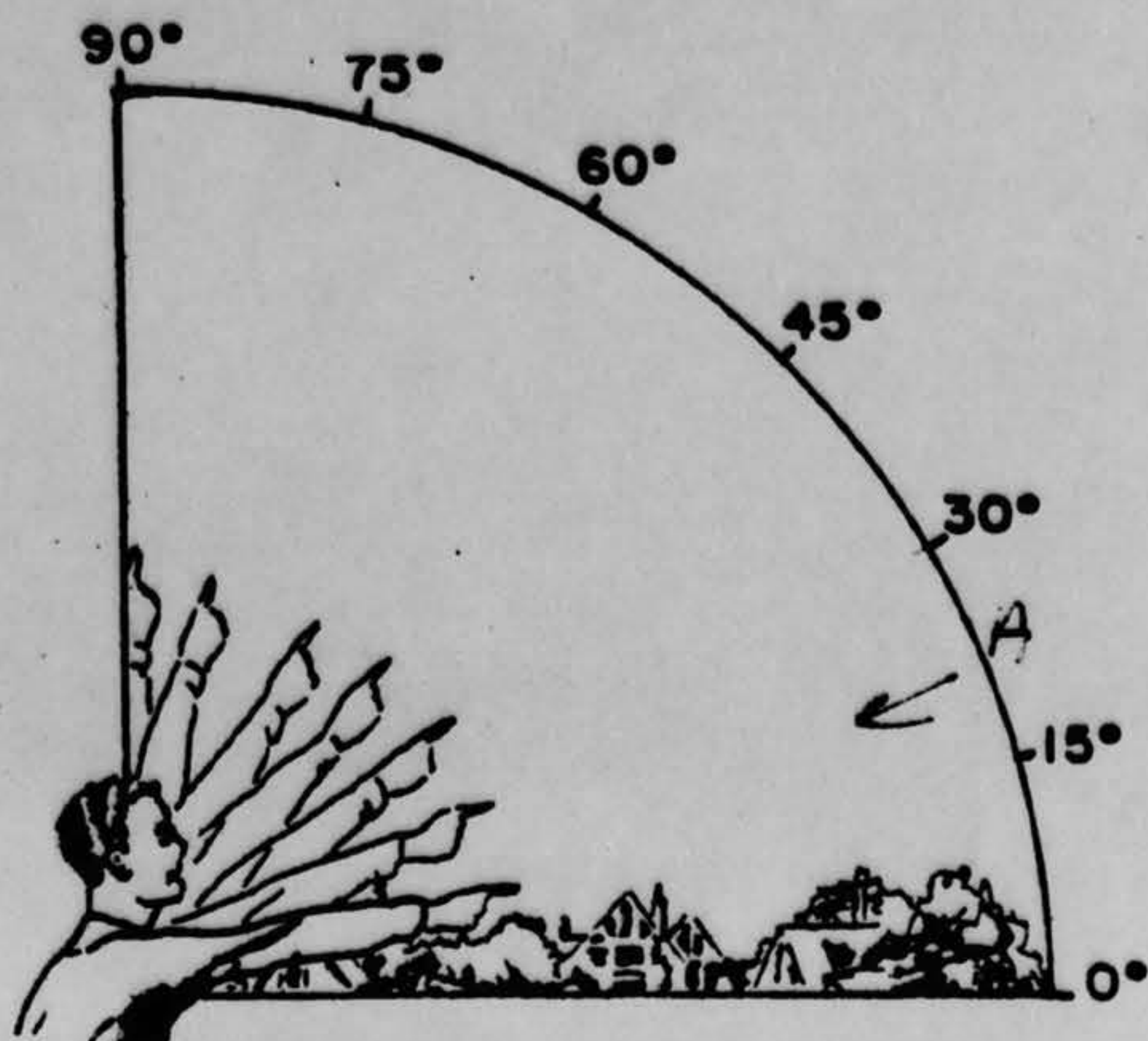
