Dear Sirs:

Enclosed are two copies of reports which I filed with NICAP. Aware of your official policy in regards to UFO reports, I did not intend to notify you of my sightings. However, upon reflection, I decided that your official policy and your policy of action may differ - in other words I tend to believe now that you are seriously interested in UFO reports and that anything I can contribute may be of value to you and to our nation. I don't care to receive an answer from you, which would be doubtful anyway. I am sure the only kind of response you would make regardless of the accuracy of the report would be one of ridicule or some assinine attempt to explain them as weather balloons, the planet Venus, or as an airplane.

I have often wondered if you are aware of the ridiculus position you have put the Air Force in by lying about various aspects of UFO sightings such as denying the fact that there has been radar trackings of UFO's. I am seriously concerned about your public position about UFO's and am hopeful that you will eventually release truthful information about them. Remember gentlemen, there is more than one way to lie - you can also do it by omission, or by playing with technicalities.

In case your first reaction to my report is one of doubt, let me say a word about myself. I have been seriously interested in UFO's since 1947 when Kenneth Arnold spotted UFOs over the State of Washington. Up until about a year ago I always maintained an element of doubt about their actual existence. I have always wanted to see one but never let this interest turn desire into a sighting. Airplanes have always turned out to be airplanes, planets remained planets. It took me 19 years to see something that firmly convinced me that it may be a UFO. So don't attempt to explain my sighting as wishful thinking. In any event, they are enclosed and I hope they will prove to be of some value to you - if only in the determination of world pattern of movement or interest.

22. Where were you and what were you doing at the time? **I was in Yellowstone National Park awaiting a night eruption of Old Faithful.**

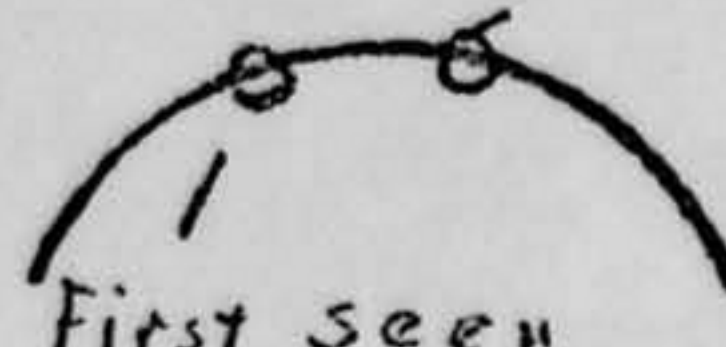

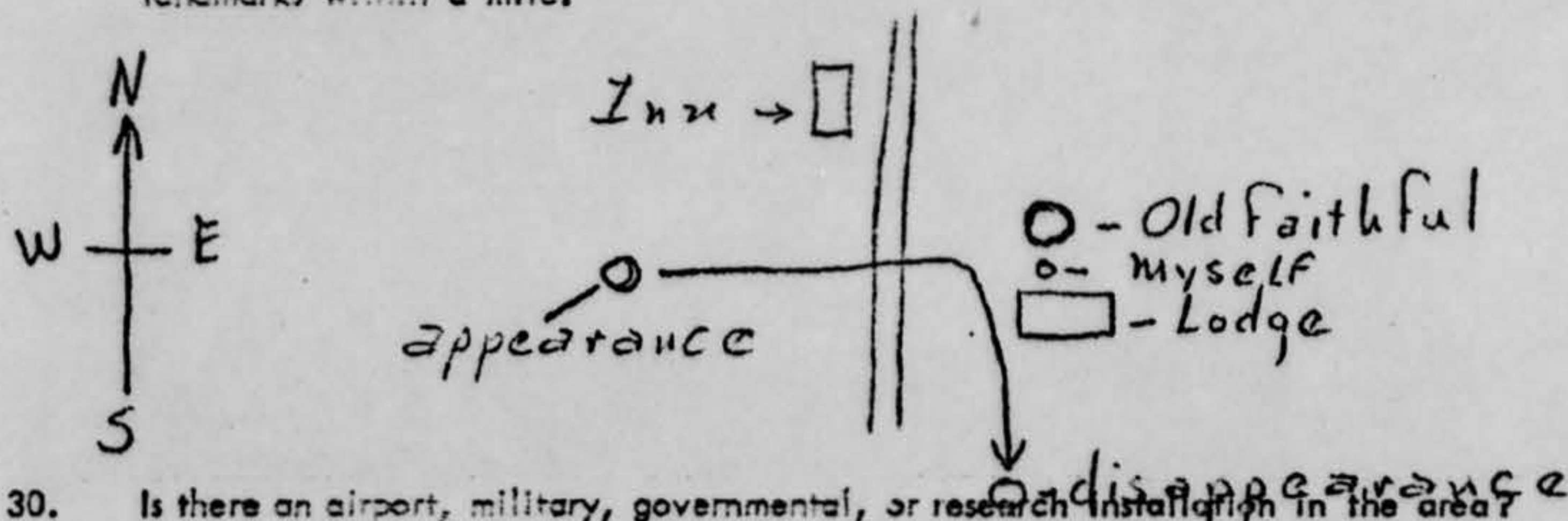

It seemed to possess the speed of a jet cruising at very high altitudes

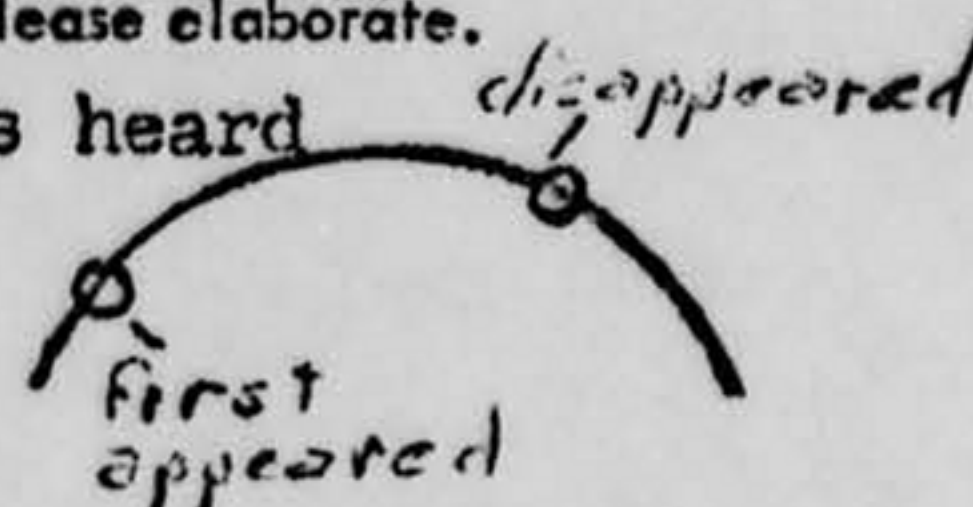

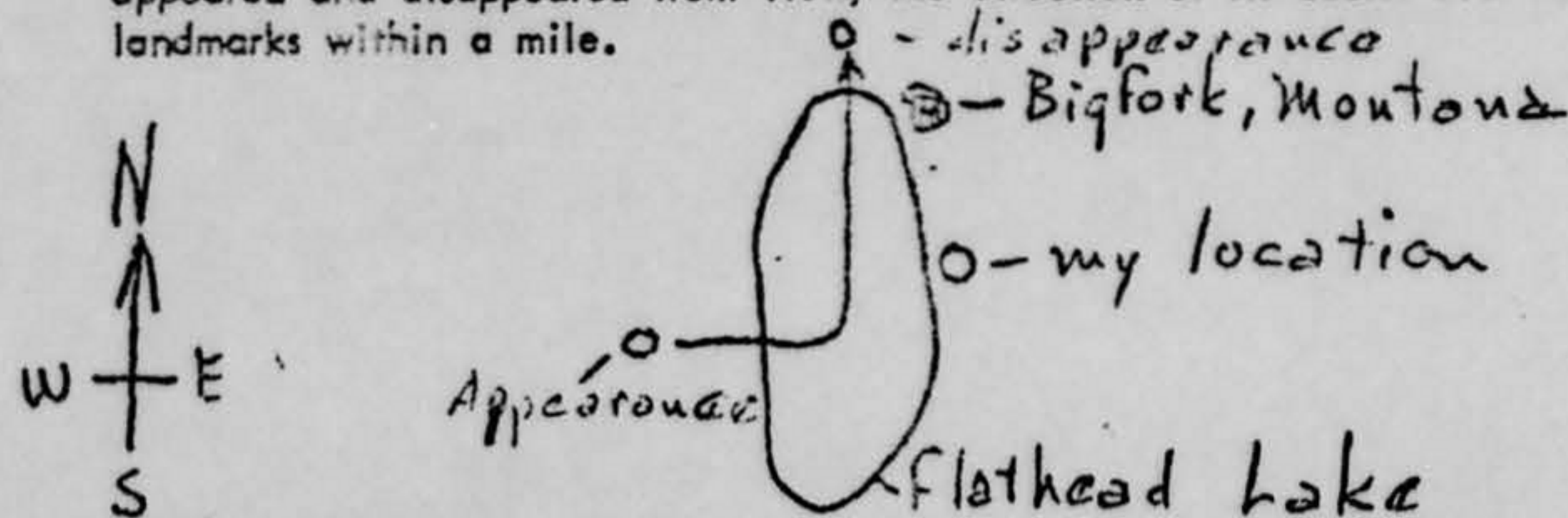

Proposed reply to letter from [REDACTED] 14 November 1966

Dear Mr. [REDACTED]:

Reference your letter of 14 November 1966 concerning your two observations. In the past three years as chief of Project Blue Book, I have never ridiculed anyone to my knowledge. I honestly believe that individuals must witness an unusual phenomena or else they would not take the time and trouble to report the observation. I know of no lying or withholding of information by the Air Force in regards to the UFO problem; this is a major misconception that has plagued the Project for years.

I want to stress that the Air Force finds itself involved with only subjective data. The only information on which to make a scientific study is that of an observer's own experience or an observer's interpretation of an experience. In no case has there been an instance where sightings have furnished scientific and technological data that could be channeled to Research and Development for their study and utilization. UFOs exist in reports only; there has been no conclusive evidence submitted to or discovered by the Air Force that our planet is being visited by extraterrestrial vehicles.

In regards to your observations, the lapse of time involved before reporting the sightings to the Air Force precludes a comprehensive evaluation. The information will most certainly be added to the present data base.

Thank you for reporting your observations to the Air Force.
