5. LENGTH OF OBSERVATION 70 Minutes	11. BRIEF SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS Observers watched an object in the western sky for over one hour before it appeared to begin to move toward the NW. The object was spinning like a top and had lights flashing from it. Its movements were similar to a helicopter-up and down sideways. It would completely black out at times and then appear in a different place. ARCTURUS being a yellow-orange colored star with a stellar magnitude of approximately 0.2 is quite bright when low on the horizon. The available information is consistent with that of a star.

live near the Benedum Air Port & planes are always flying over. At the time we heard the plane the object dropped down behind the trees & disappeared. After the plane had passed over & we couldn't hear the motor any longer the object appeared above the trees again & began moving southeast picking up speed. In a few seconds it was gone. To say the least we were mystified. Remembering what my sister had told me about the object she had seen I went directly to my neighbors & called her. After I had given her my description she said it was exactly what she had seen. She told me to report it to the paper. I did so immediately. The editor & I talked for at least half an hour & then ~~she~~ the second person to report it that same night. Having no person present who could identify it we could do nothing, although the editor gave me as much information as she had on other objects that had been seen by local residents & even one of her relations. The next day I looked through some old magazines & found a Life magazine with pictures & stories on strange objects. There was also an article on your office, investigations & findings. 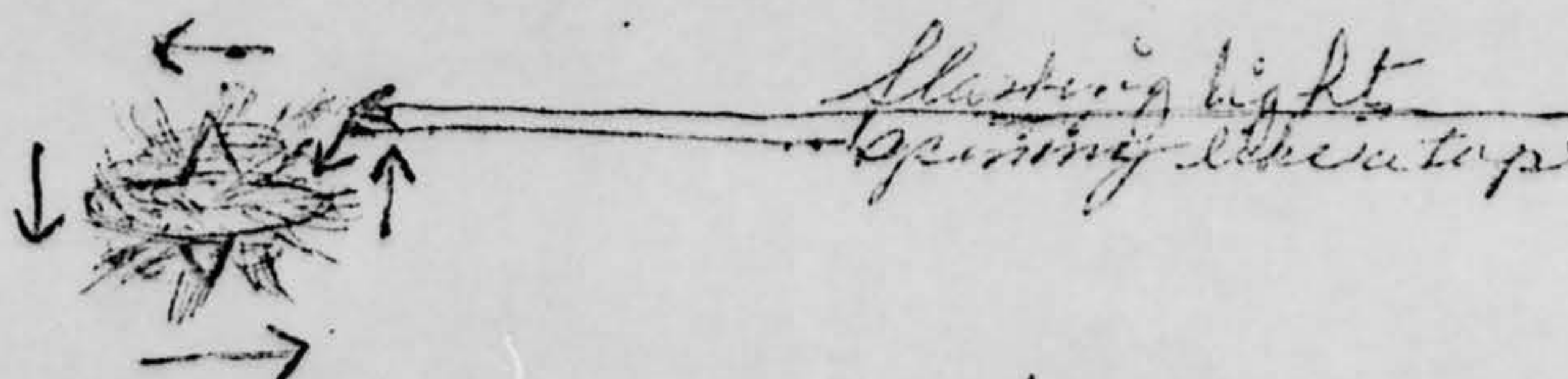

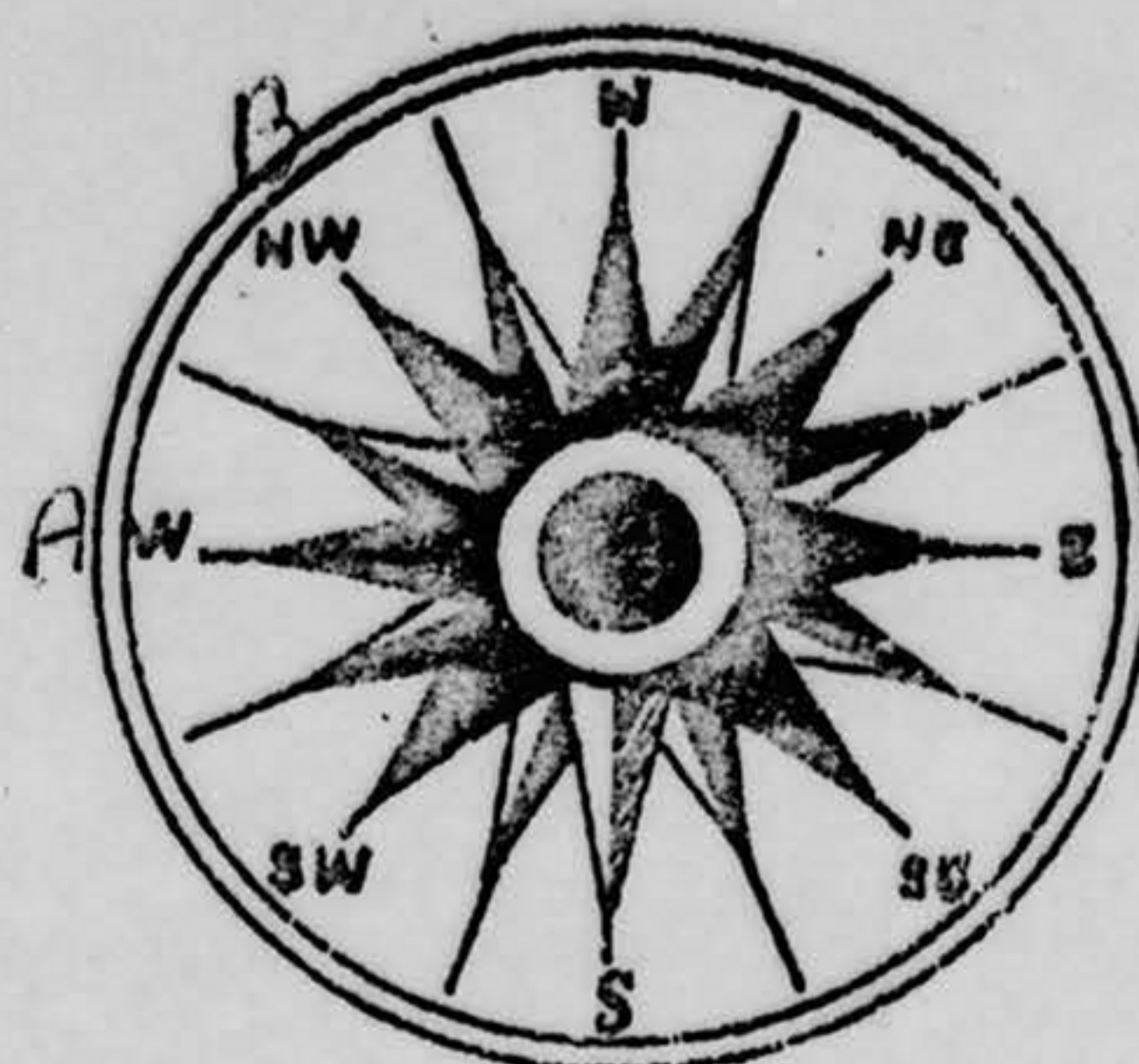
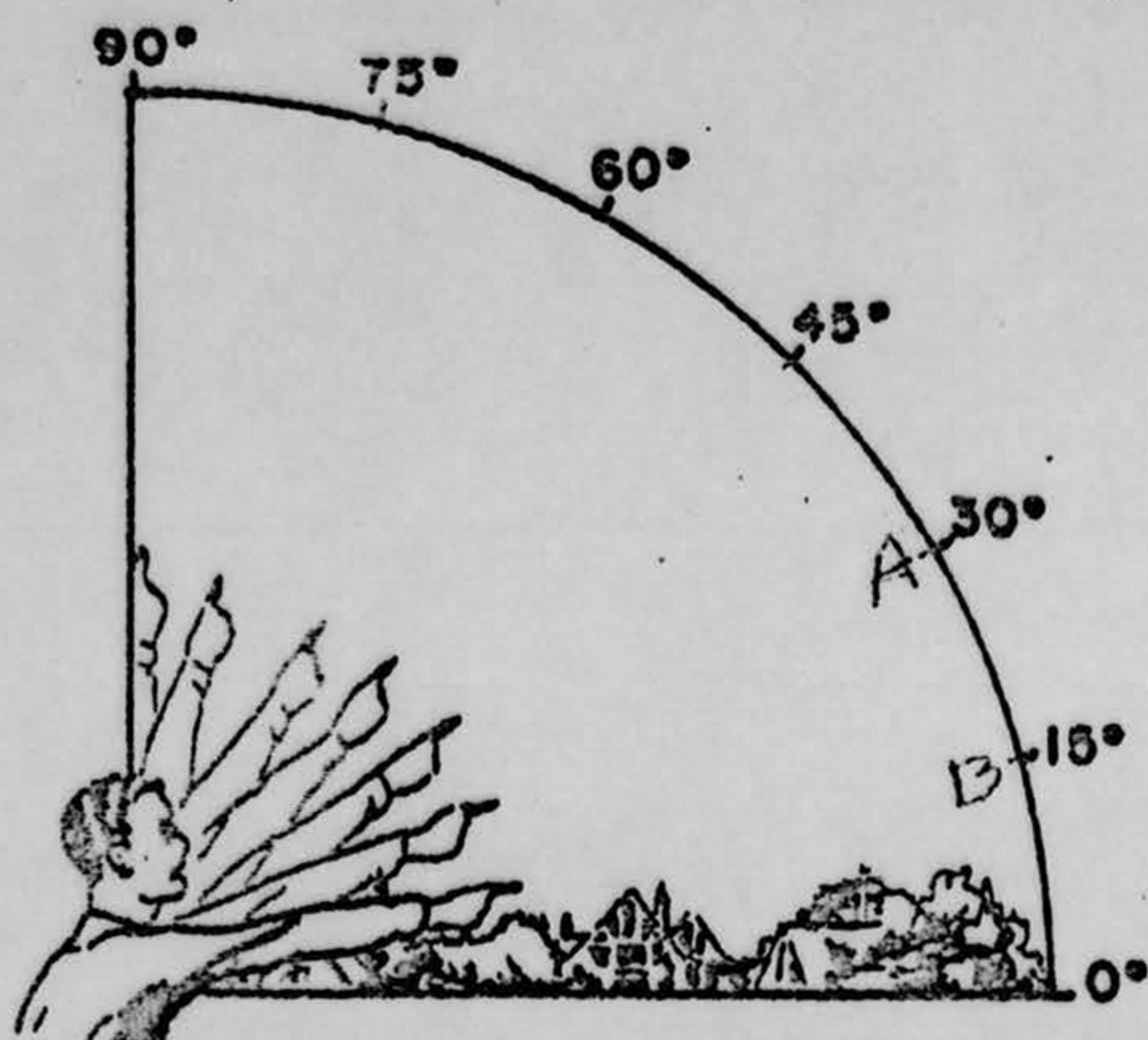

I filled this out the very day I received it. We live at Resford out from Clarksburg. We have lived here almost 5 yrs. We should receive our ~~mail~~ mail at (Box 238 Rt. 2 Clarksburg) but due to the fact my husband drives tractor & trailer we kept the post office box at Rutherford. Because he gets important papers with the mail which could get lost otherwise. I have no means of transportation right now & sometimes it is weeks before I get the mail so if it seems to be a long time since I returned this form it is because of the delay in receiving it.

I tried to fill out the questionnaire as best as I could & will swear to what I saw as being an object I have never seen before. It was spinning like a top & had lights flashing from it. ~~It was not a helicopter.~~ Its movements were similar to a helicopter up & down & sideways. It would completely black out at times & then appear in a different place. Usually behind the tree tops or above them. It then moved off N.W. going towards a place called Glen Falls. It apparently was moving fast as we only saw it for a little while after it started moving. It seemed to be on a course.
