

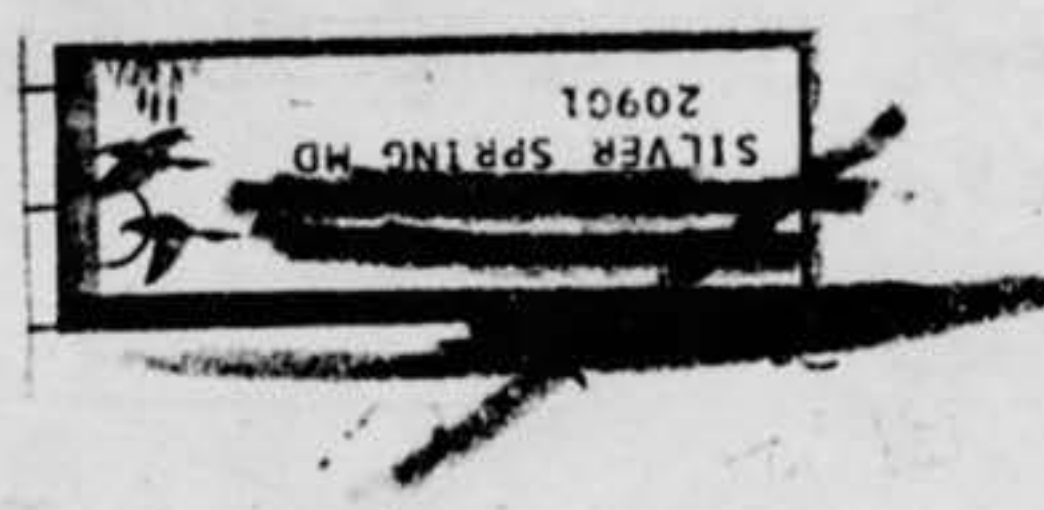

The object had a yellowish inside area changing to a reddish hue on the edges. No exhaust or vapor trail was noted. It looked like it might have been shot out of something. It made the observer think of a bullet because it was the fastest thing the witness had ever seen. No flames were seen but the object looked like it was red hot, like hot coals in a furnace. Observer has seen other quite different things in the past few months. The description is consistent with that of a meteor observation. The colors are consistent with that normally reported. The short duration prevented the observer from providing a more complete description of the object.

Mrs. Dixon Predicts

In a candle-light room of
the Georgetown Inn yesterday,
Washington (prophetess) Jean
Dixon could have been the
central figure in a Greek
tragedy.

She addressed wives of the
Federal Bar Association,
meeting in convention here
this week.

In fact, she compared her
 plight with mythological
Cassandra, the seeress who
was given the powers of
prophecy.

'Like Cassandra'

When Apollo turned against
Cassandra, she was not a vest-
ige of her gift, but it was
ordained that no one would
believe her.

Mrs. Dixon, who says she
foresaw President Kennedy's
assassination and vainly tried
to prevent his Texas trip, has
had a strong vision since the
beginning of July.

"I have felt there is an
object orbiting the earth in a
path of a blue belt... with
the initials... M I R V..."
Mrs. Dixon revealed.

"There may be letters in
between, but I have not seen
them. This object is of Rus-
sian origin. It appears to me
like the front of a submarine
which possesses torpedoes,
tubes, and can fire atomic
missiles."

"Each one of these and has
has a different brain, and is
capable of going to different
targets."

Other predictions included
her assurance that we will
have bigger wars than Viet
Nam, which she described as
a little bonfire compared to
future combats, and the
increase of sabotage of pri-
vately owned U.S. industry all
over the world.

Part of Mrs. Dixon's speech
was almost devotional in
quality. "I believe with all my
heart that there is a purpose
to all life, and the Lord has
devised a grand plan with
places for each one of us to
occupy."

"I am convinced that it is
our responsibility to develop
our talents and skills and
fulfill our purpose in life."

much in demand as a speaker
since she broke into the news

Durham, N. C.

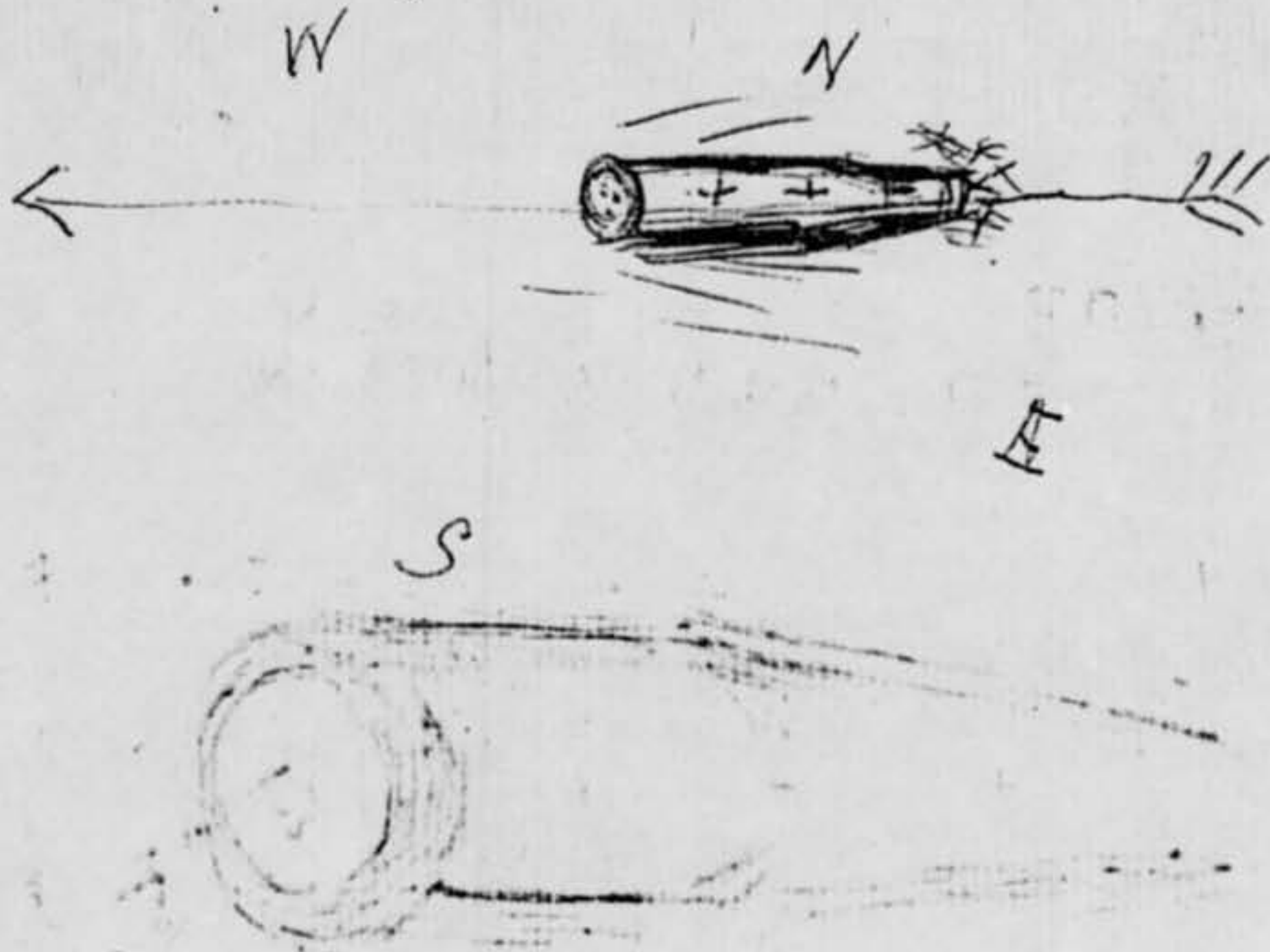
Ninety wives of members of

Submarine Shaped UFO reported

An unidentified flying object, (UFO), recently prophesied by Jeanne Dixon is claimed to have been seen two years ago by a Silver Spring woman.

Mrs. Florence D. Hanson, of 308 Franklin Place, said she had seen a "submarine-shaped" unidentified flying object on Sept. 26, 1964. It seemed to match the description of a flying object Jeanne Dixon said she had seen.

Mrs. Dixon's visionary UFO, mentioned in her book, "A Gift of Prophecy," was supposedly a missile carrier of Russian origin.

Believing there was a connection between the two objects, Mrs. Hanson wrote to Mrs. Dixon, but she said she has not yet received a reply.

Of her own UFO sighting, Mrs. Hanson commented, "I'll never forget it.

"The object came out of the

sky with a 'swishing' sound, she said, and flew about 400 feet high at a distance of 300 feet from where I was standing."

There were three distinct lights on the side of the UFO, Mrs. Hanson continued, and sparks were emitted from the tail with a sizzling sound. The object had no wings and no wheels, she said, and resembled the front of a submarine or a spark plug.

"It actually shook the earth when it passed over," she insisted. "I became really frightened.

In addition to the flying submarine, Mrs. Hanson said she had spotted two other UFO's.

The first sighting, she remarked, occurred eight years ago when she and her husband saw a broad beam of light following a definite course in the sky.

The most recent sighting happened about three weeks ago. Viewing the object from the

ground, she said, it was about the size of a golf ball and followed a zig-zag course through the sky. Lights on the ball illuminated it. A fine line trailed from the back of the object like exhaust fumes, Mrs. Hanson said.

Mrs. Hanson has many theories about UFO's, and in her letter to Jeanne Dixon she mentioned several of them.

"There are several atomic reactors in the Washington area," she commented, "and I wonder if there is any connection between the reactors and the large number of UFO sightings in this area."

"I would like to know," Mrs. Hanson continued, "if any students have seen or are interested in UFO's."

"I often wonder," Mrs. Hanson said, "if some people are chosen to see these objects. Not everyone can see them."

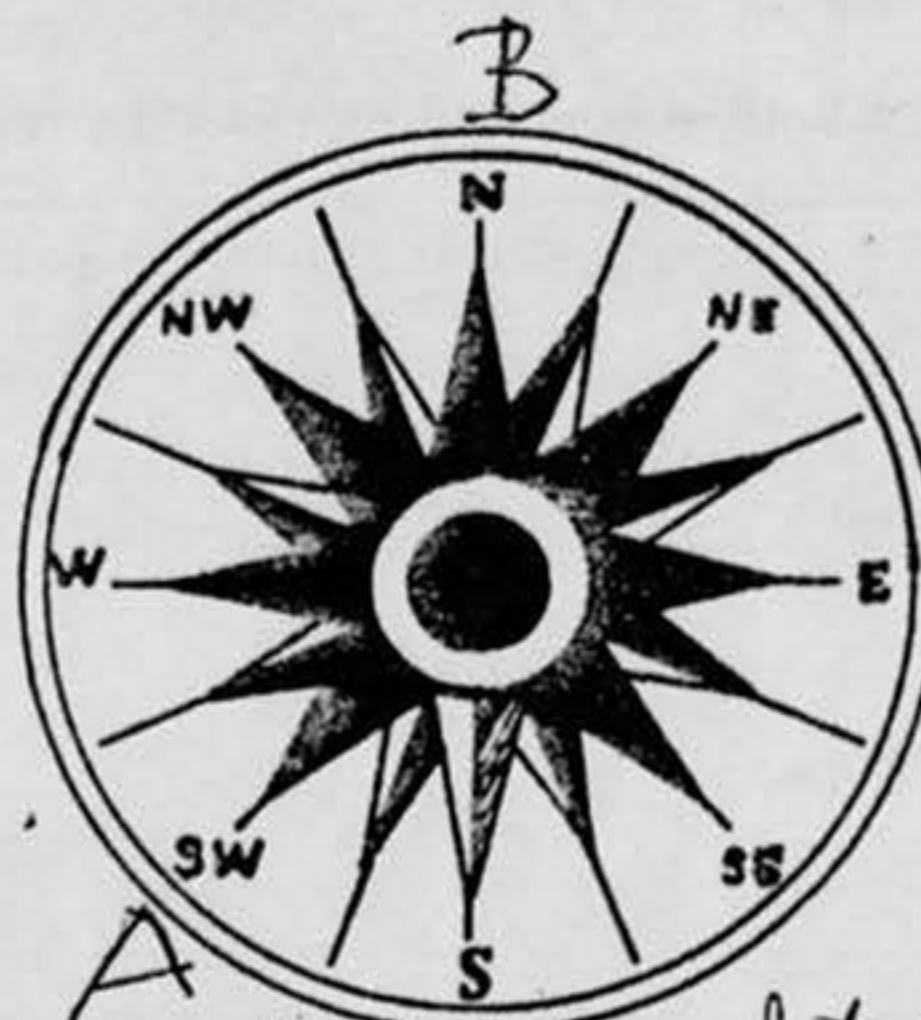
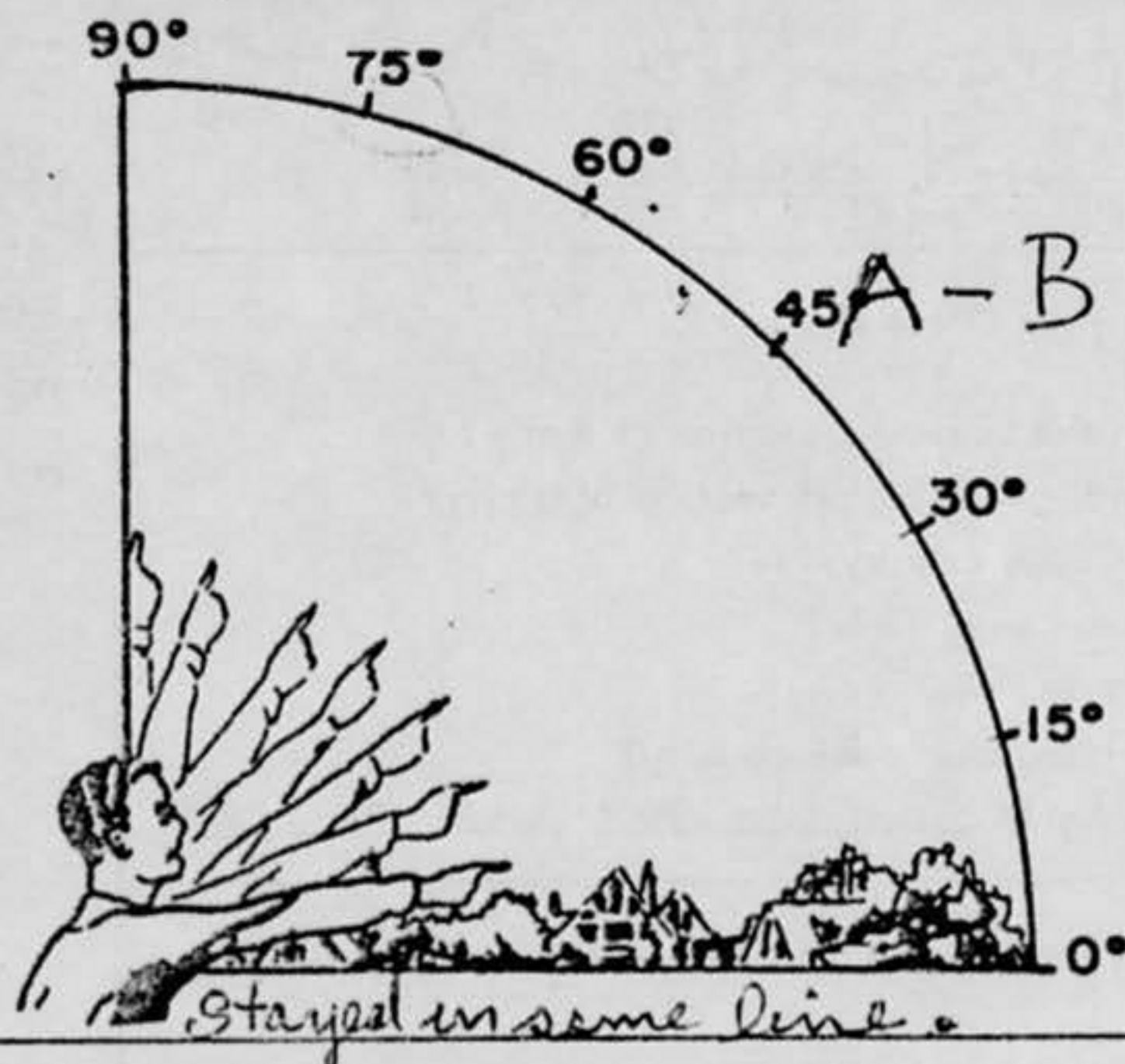

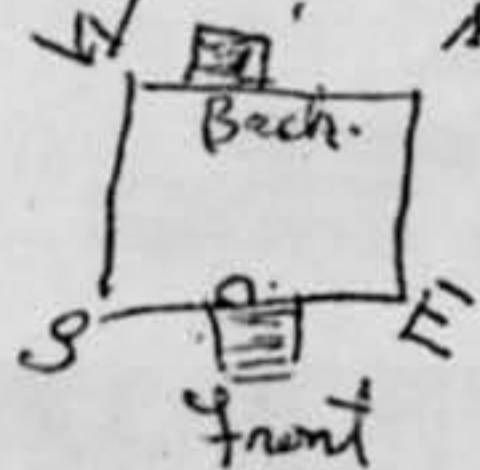
