A. (1) UFO SAUCER SHAPED. DESCRIBED BY SAYING IT LOOKED LIKE ONE
SAUCER INVERTED ON TOP OF ANOTHER SAUCER. SMOOTH, NO PROTU-
BANCES.

(2) AS LARGE AS A SEMITRUCK IN WIDTH AND 10 FT TO 15 FT IN
HEIGHT.

B. (1) IT BLOCKED THE ROAD ON WHICH SHE WAS DRIVING

(2) ZERO DEGREE ELEVATION. UFO WAS SITTING ON THE ROAD

(3) APPROXIMATELY 45 DEGREES

(4) UFO WAS MOTIONLESS ON THE GROUND WHEN ENCOUNTERED. THEN IT BECAME AIRBORNE AT A VERY SHALLOW ANGLE (5 TO 10 DEGREES), CUT ACROSS AN OPEN FIELD AND MOVED TO WITHIN 6 YARDS OF HER CAR WHILE SHE WAS DRIVING DOWN AN ENTRANCE LANE TO INTERSTATE 75 (TRAVELING SOUTH). IT STAYED A FEW YARDS ABOVE AND BEHIND HER CAR FOR THE NEXT TWO MILES UNTIL A SEMITRUCK APPROACHED FROM THE

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OPPOSITE DIRECTION
