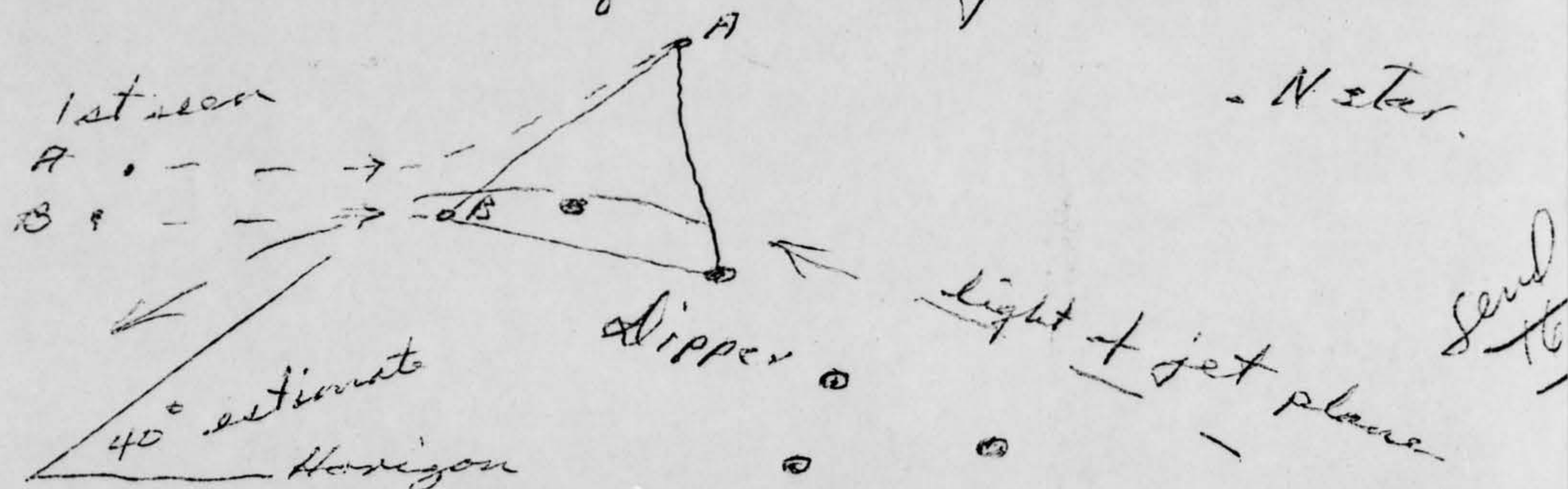

On Nov 29th, 1966 about 9 P.M.
