1. In accordance with AFR 200-2, the following information regarding reported UFO's is submitted:

2. Mrs. [REDACTED] sighted an unidentified object during the month of December 1966.

3. Description of the object:

a. The object looked like a hat, with a flat top and no windows or openings.

b. The object was about the size of a two-engine aircraft.

c. Only one object was sighted.

d. Object was copper colored, with a dull finish.

e. No trail or exhaust was visible.

f. No sounds were heard from the object.

4. Description of course of object:

a. The observer saw the object while standing in her back yard.

b. The angle of elevation was about 45 degrees.

c. The object came from behind a cloud, remaining stationary for about a minute, then going back into the same cloud.

d. The object did not reappear from the cloud.

e. The object appeared NW of Mrs. [REDACTED] house.

5. Manner of observation:

a. Ground visual was the method of observation.

9. Weather:

a. Observer stated that the weather was partly cloudy at the time of the sighting.

b. No report on weather, since Mrs. [REDACTED] could not remember the date as to the sighting.

10. Comments of Investigating Officer:

It is the investigator's opinion that Mrs. [REDACTED] seemed rational. This office was not able to come to any conclusion as to the nature of the object sighted. The investigation was hampered by the fact that Mrs. [REDACTED] could not remember the time or date of the sighting, plus her tardiness in reporting the object.
