1. In accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 14, AFR 200-2, the following information is forwarded.

3. 14b (1) - The area near the initial observation point lit up; (2) - 0 - 45° elevation, 270° azimuth (approximate); (3) - same as item (2); (4) - Objects #1 and #2 appeared ahead of and disappeared to the left of observer. Object #3 appeared ahead of and above the observer and very close to the POV she was driving. Object #4 appeared to the right of the observer and burst in that position. Object #5 appeared and burst at the rear of the vehicle.; (5) - instantaneously; (6) - less than one minute.

I'll try and explain about the night I saw the objects. Generally - it was dark and cloudy all around, and raining quite heavily. Before I saw the blue objects the area lit up. The light was bright white-like fluorescent.

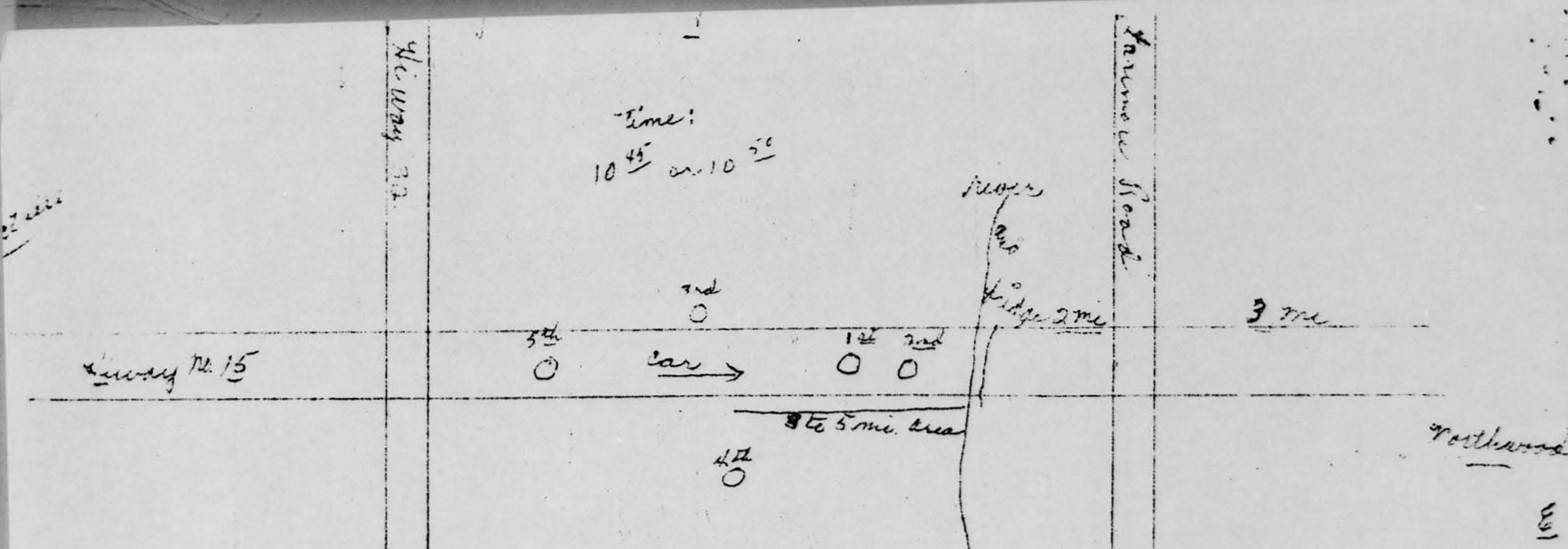
Ball ~~no 1~~ was maybe 1/2 mi. ahead. The area lit up, then the big ball was there - seemed to sit on the road. It disappeared after an instant. I drove slowly and ball ~~no 2~~ showed up in the same way. It seemed to turn and go to the left slightly & disappeared. I was quite startled by them.

Within seconds the bright light ^{no 3} came above the car to the left of where I sat. If the window had been open I could have reached the stars that burst from it. I don't remember a noise when it burst as it was so surprising anyway. Shortly after came the light ~~no 4~~ to the ~~right~~ ^{left} of the car & slightly higher up but noticable thru the corner of the windshield. It burst & was full of yellow stars also. I still hadn't gathered all my wits before the last light came ^{no 5} from the rear of the car. Everything was the same as other two and I looked in my rear view mirror and watched it.

I was really too excited to work that night but I did. And believe it or not, I stayed on the road thru it all - I think.

I've been really thrilled about this as it's mysterious and will be waiting till it can be explained.
