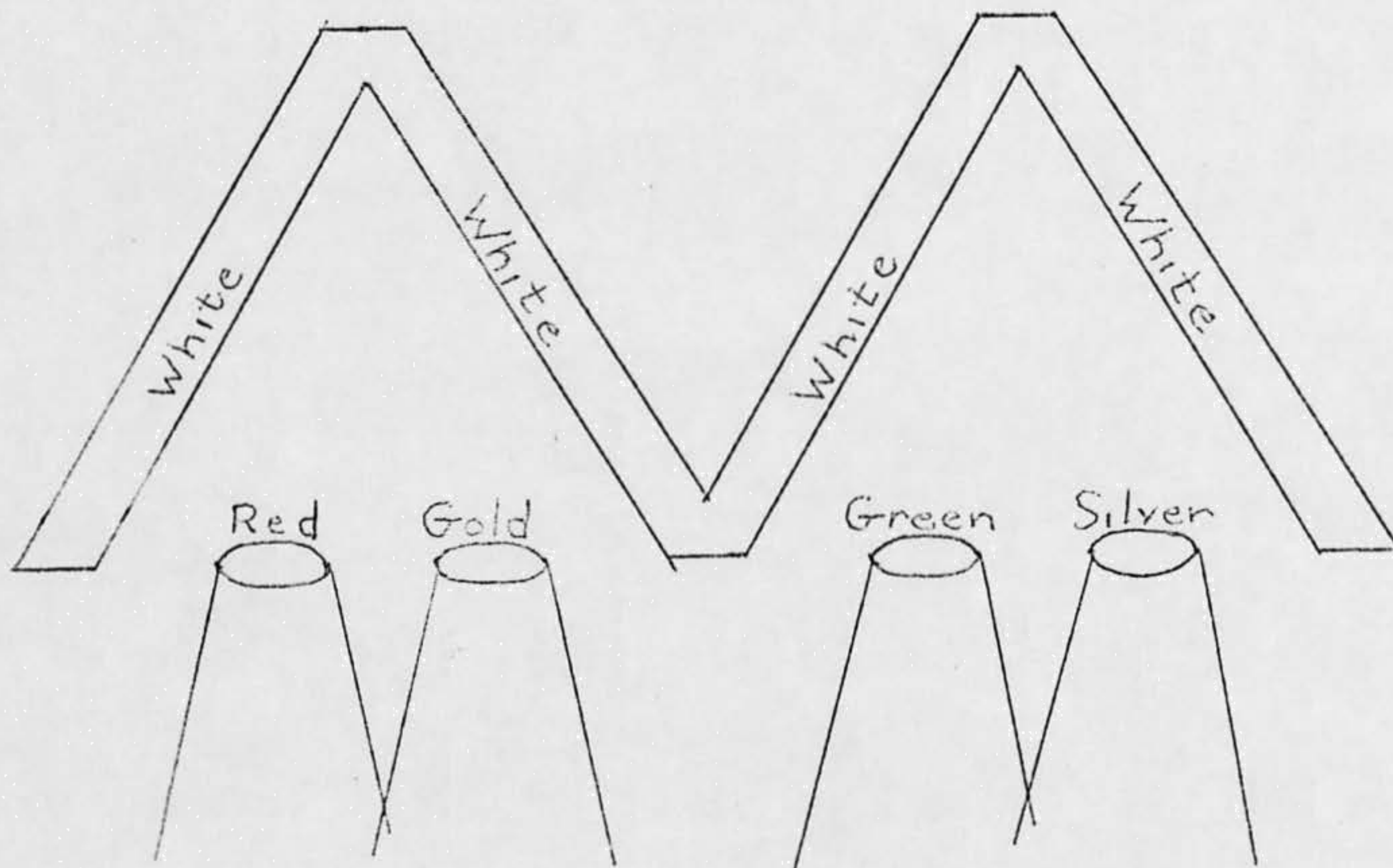

The above configuration of lights is composed of a white band of light forming an inverted "W" and four lights, placed and colored as shown, shining vertically downward. The red and gold lights were steady. The green and silver lights alternated in illumination. The estimated total height of the pattern of lights is six (6) feet.
