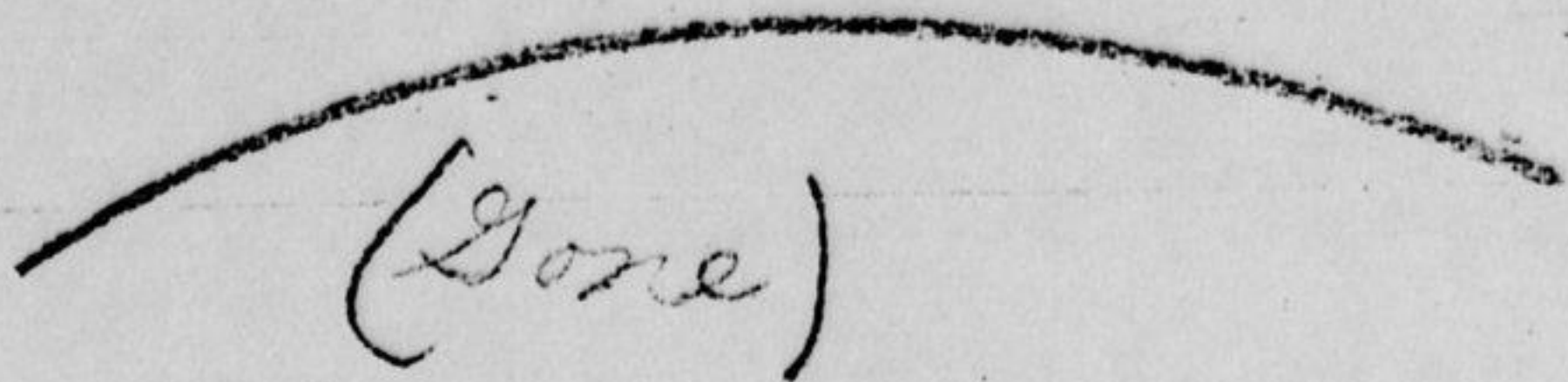

25. I observed the object through a telescope & with my naked eye.

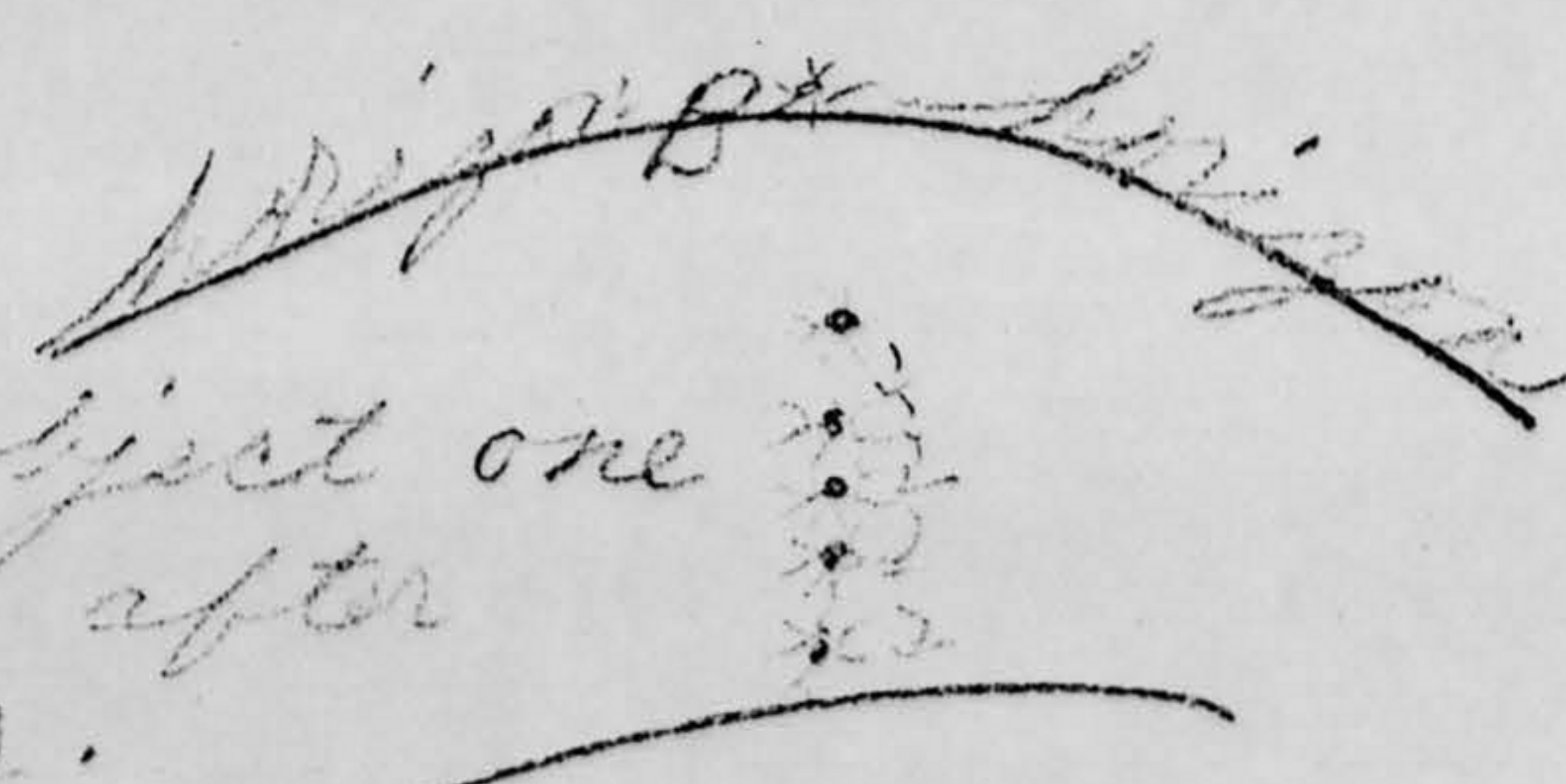
26. A star (at night) sort of flashing red and white, and very close to the earth with out heat or fast movement would be like what I saw.
