Locality of observer: on second floor, in house at above address
Weather: clear night, stars visible, no moon or wind
Number of objects: one
Details: with naked eye, object appeared as a 0.0 magnitude star, with binoculars, object appeared cigar-shaped, with domes on top and bottom
Color: with naked eye, object appeared white, like a star, with binoculars, cigar was white and domes were red
Illumination: object appeared transparent with white and red lights within, when viewed through binoculars
Sound: none
Maneuvers: Object first observed traveling south over Town Plot (a hill in Waterbury), near forested area of Town Plot object turned left, traveling east (at this time, use of binoculars began). When object was almost directly south of observer, object turned (up to this time, illumination of object did not increase or decrease in brightness) and began to fade, probably traveling directly south (at this time, use of binoculars discontinued). Object gradually faded and disappeared, not to be seen again.
During entire sighting, object blinked off and on, approximately once every two seconds.
During entire sighting, object remained at same level, approximately 20 to 30 degrees above the horizon.
Speed: steady speed, slower than a piston plane
Other observers: Mrs. Stanley Horzempa (my mother), (same address as above)
Additional information: When observed with naked eye, object appeared as a star, with binoculars, object appeared somewhat fuzzy.
At time of sighting, no conventional aircraft was observed in area.
Object was first observed, when I happened to glance towards Town Plot, while I was star-gazing with a telescope. (I tried, unsuccessfully, to observe object through telescope)
Object was called to the attention of second observer at 8:12 PM. Third person (my sister) was called, arrived at time when object was fading, but was not able to definitely observe object.

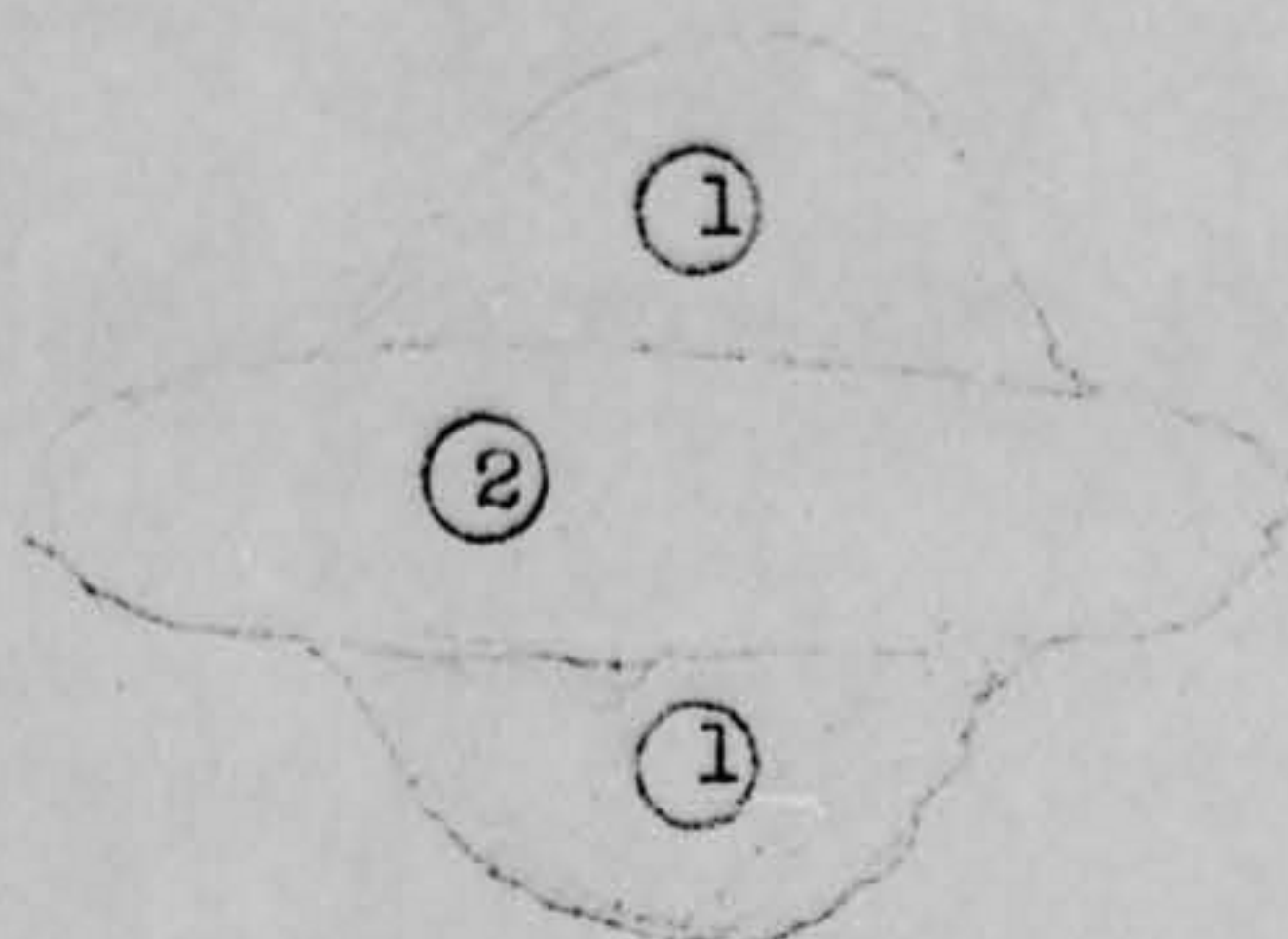
