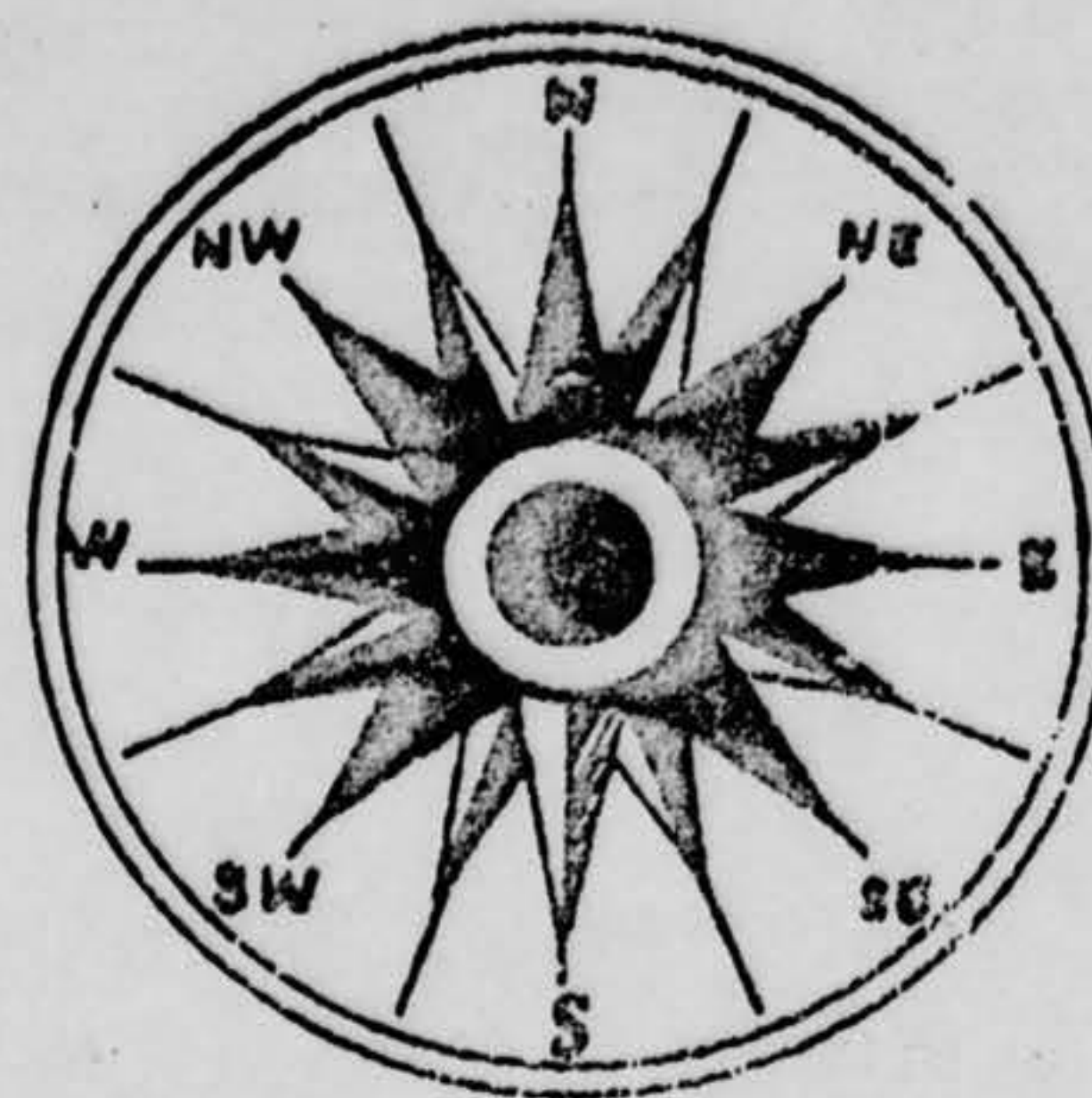
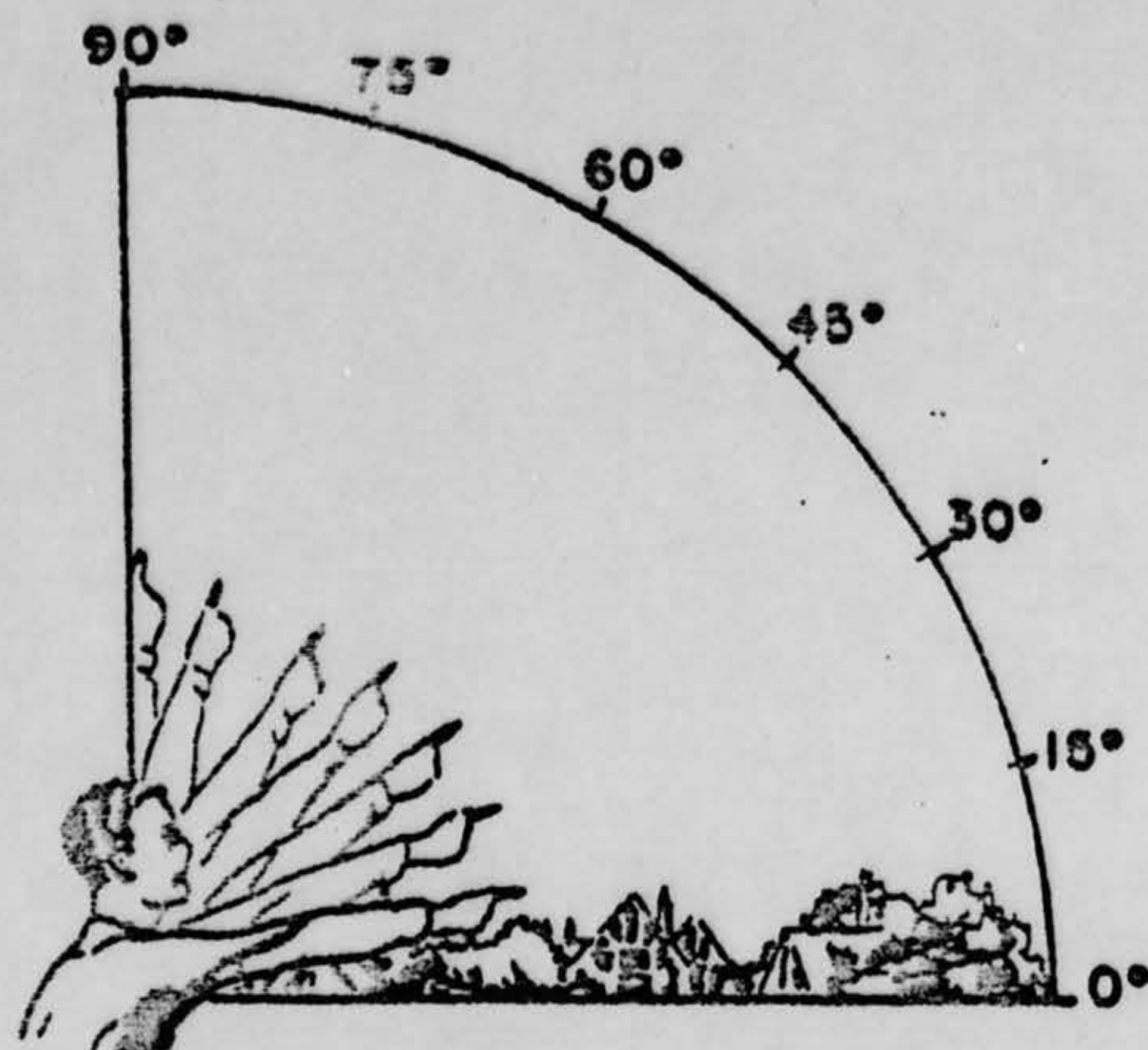

A supplemental call was received from the FAA flight service at Morgantown, W. Va. at 2150 hrs. The Object (orange) was sighted again by 6 persons in the tower, at 2142 hrs. Also, the policeman who saw it earlier was an off-duty Lt., and his wife & neighbors also saw it. Object seen second time moved west to east (as seen from tower). Caller was a Mr. [REDACTED]

Note 2320 hrs 7 Mar 67

Received supplemental call from Morgantown FAA service center, many, many --- sightings of object. Two flew over airport, and then disappeared. There is a report of a very low altitude flight where an object was noted on top which looked like an elongated balloon.

Note 0200 hrs 8 Mar

Received call from tower again, objects may be fake.

Memo for the Record: 6 April 67

Contact was made with Mr. [REDACTED] FAA service station (292-3632), Morgantown, West Virginia. Mr. [REDACTED] said that students were releasing hot air balloons on the night of the numerous sightings. The tower received many calls from local persons regarding orange colored objects in the sky. Two objects flew over the airport. It was determined that the alleged UFOs were hot air balloons. One of the balloons came down in a residential area and was recovered by the local police department.
