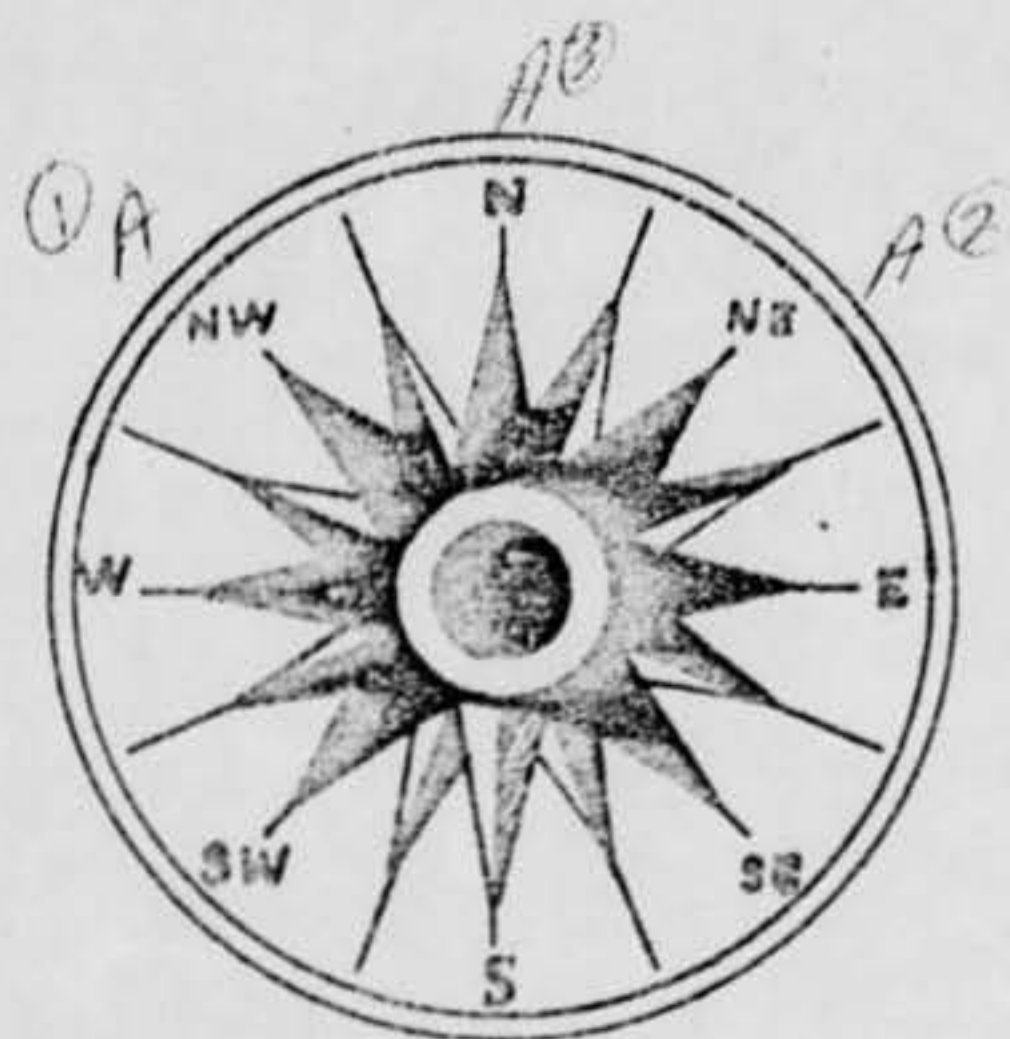
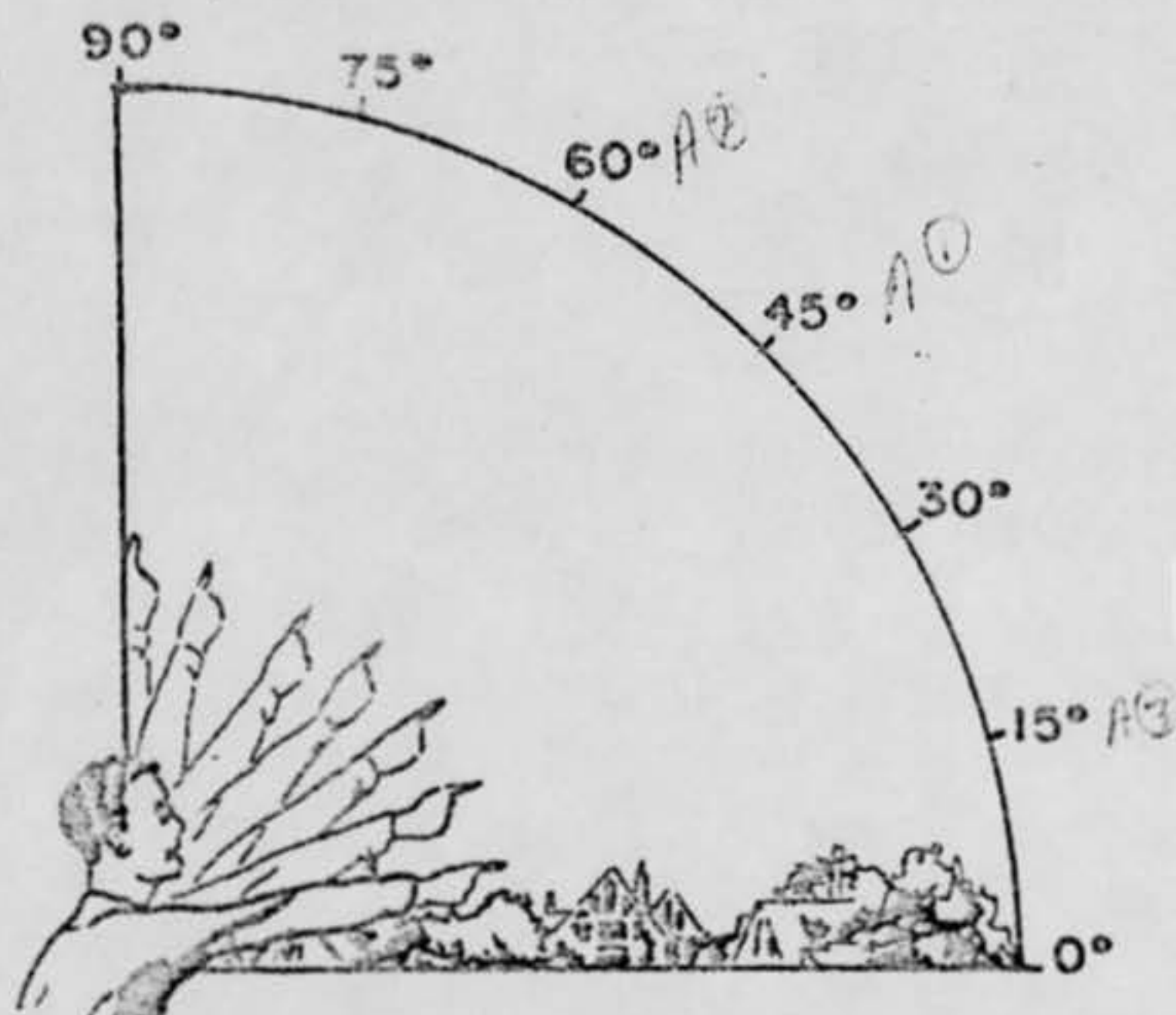

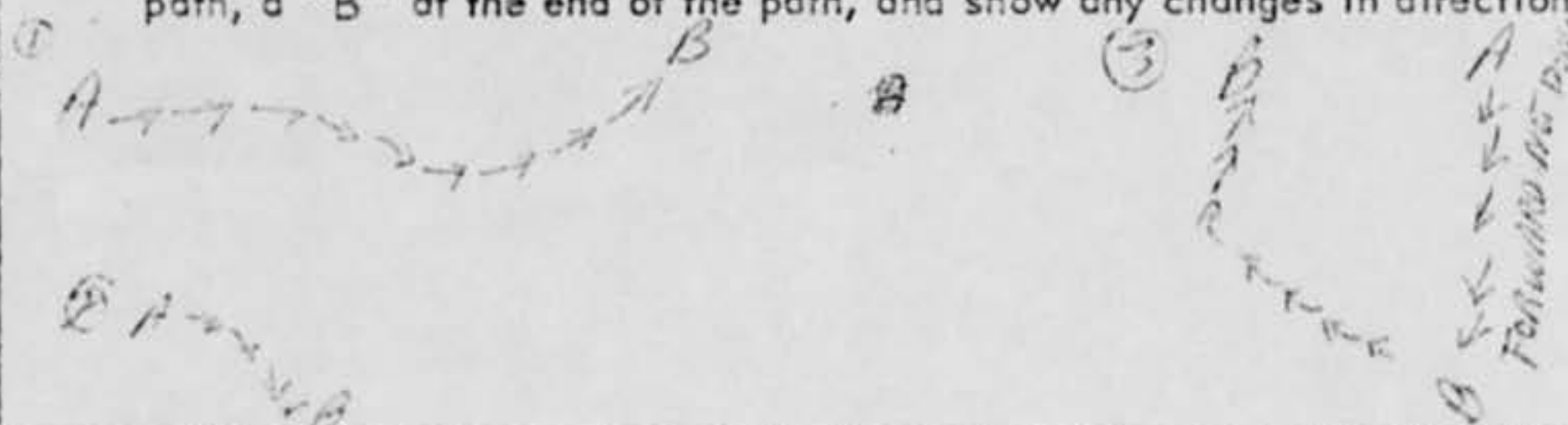

THESE STATEMENTS PLUS THE FACT THAT OBSERVERS SEEMED COMPLETELY RELIABLE INDICATE OBSERVERS MAY HAVE SIGHTED A PHENOMENON OF SOME SORT. MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE IS NOT KNOWN TO BE AN AREA OF ATMOSPHERIC PHENOMENA; THEREFORE, THIS POSSIBILITY IS RULED OUT. THE MEMPHIS COTTON CARNIVAL CURRENTLY IS IN PROGRESS WHETHER SOME DEVICE SUCH AS A BLIMP ASSOCIATED WITH THAT OCCASION COULD HAVE BEEN THE CAUSE OF THE SIGHTING IS UNKNOWN. 14. Did the object disappear while you were watching it? If so, how? Three sightings of object was observed. First time object was bright orange and then appeared to change to very light orange, grow dim and suddenly go upward at an angle and disappeared in seconds. At did this repeatedly two or three times. Last and within 30 seconds it then grew. Second sighting object was orange, grew dimmer and went straight down in a few seconds, disappearing as we watched. Third sighting was over my back yard at range of about 700 yards. It nearly blinded me but as I watched it moved up in slow motion at third degree turn to my left behind trees and disappeared. My own reaction was from yard again at the moment I sped nearly straight up.
