I was there about 5 min. As I left, I said to her: "I want you to come outside and see the most beautiful sight you have ever seen in the city". I looked for it, and couldn't see it. I was very puzzled and decided I must have been behind ^{one} of the neighboring houses. I was in a hurry to leave and couldn't take the time to walk around the yard & street, to find it from another angle.

But that night I spent an hour attempting to locate it - the "planet" on my sky map. I was mystified that I couldn't identify which planet it would be. Two evenings later, the city paper published an account of sightings on Dec. 13th. So I then realized I had seen a UFO. In the meantime, one night

give a narrative account here and shall

On Dec 14th, 7 PM. CST, clear, starry
night, at 3000 Lander Rd, on shore on the
shore of Lake Superior. I said to my
husband. "I saw the most beautiful planet
last night and I couldn't find it on my new
(recently given me by aforementioned Air-Rover
officer) sky map. Let's see if we can see it
now." We looked at the window, facing
NE, and saw a similar appearing object, possibly
slightly higher ^{sky} and larger. As we looked,
it moved, ^{first seemingly toward us (W) then slowly} in a slight arc, to the NW & disap-
peared. Another one appeared in same spot. a
third and a fourth, all following same course.
The fourth appeared to be trailing a glider(?)
from which colored small lights, mostly red,
flowed. We went outdoors but heard no sound.

Position Title and Comments of Preparing Officer: On 14 December (the next night) between 2400Z and 0100Z, Mrs. [REDACTED] said she and her husband saw 4 more objects of the same size, shape, and color in the NE, about 30 degrees above the horizon. Each approached the observers, then went west, and either the third or fourth had small lights immediately behind it. Mrs. [REDACTED] claimed a slight interest in and knowledge of astronomy. When briefly questioned, she was able to name most of the ten planets, though not in order from the sun. She and her husband went outside and heard no sound, and she said a star chart showed no bright stars or planets in that part of the sky.

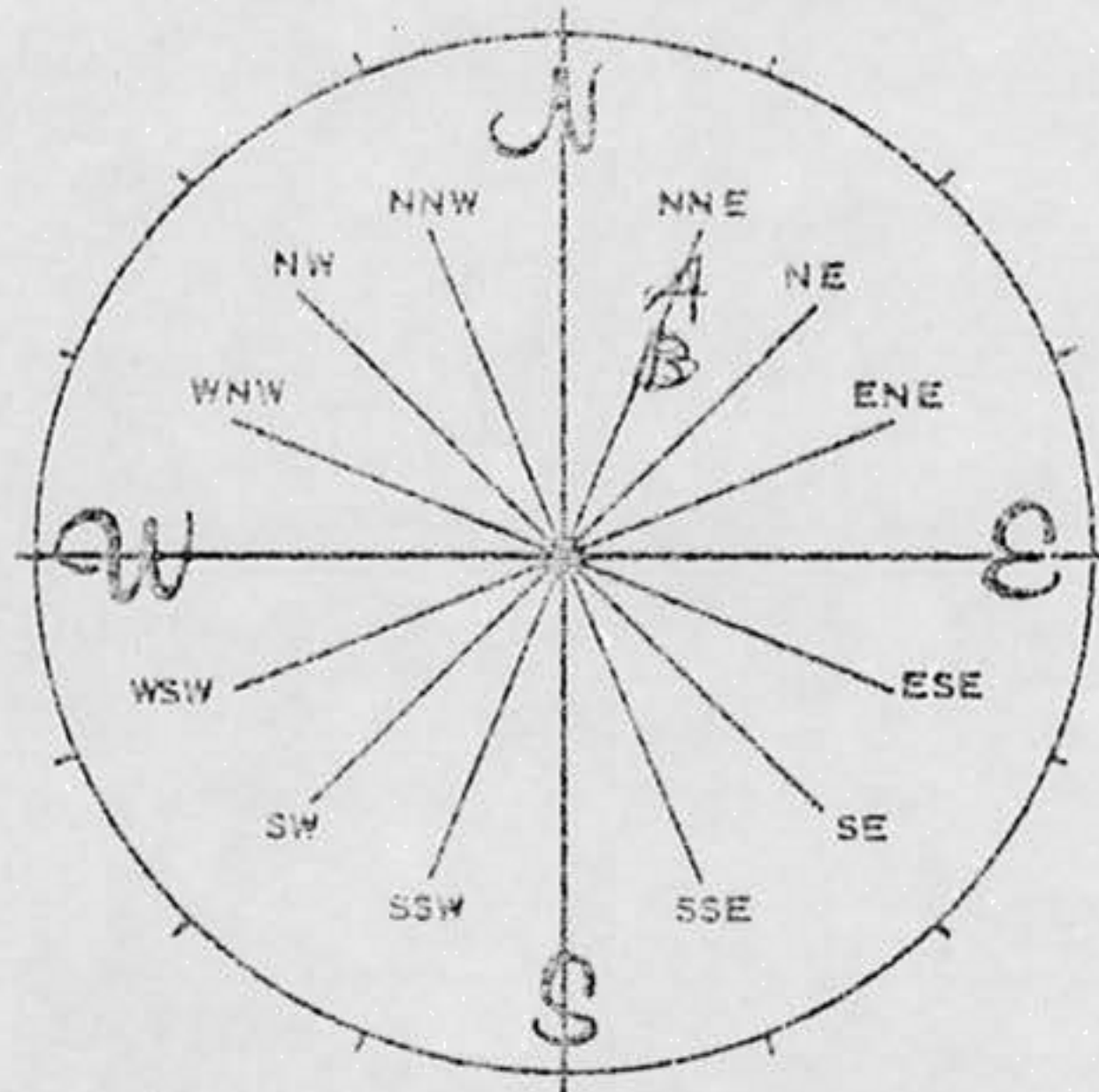

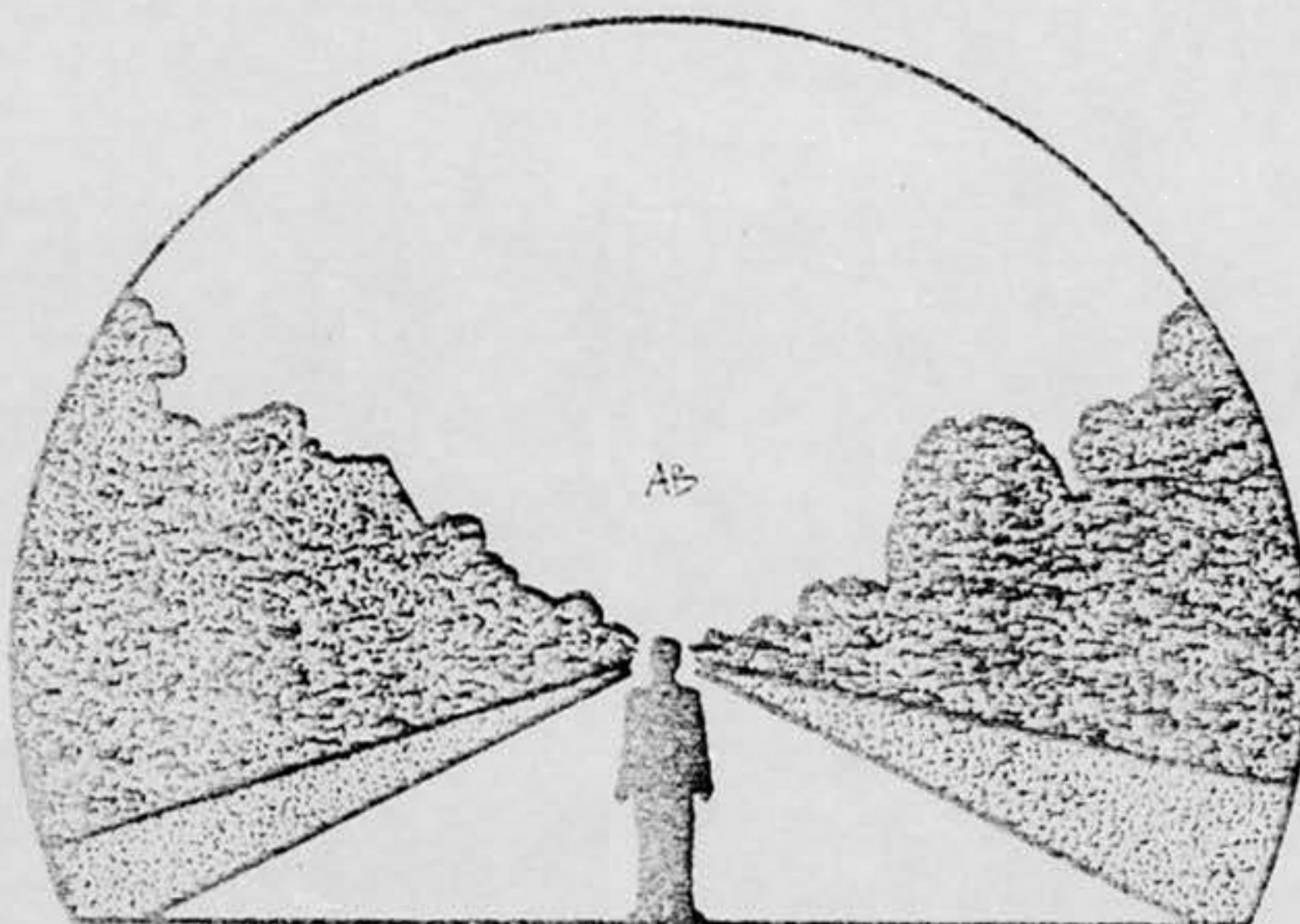

Object appeared to be, and was taken by observer as, an unusually brilliant planet, rising near the horizon. Self-luminous, no color solid. Sharp (as a planet's) edges, round, not a point of light, but a ball of light. It was the largest object I had ever observed in sky at night, except moon.
