Introduction.

- (1) large disc, about six inches in diameter.
- (2) Two smaller discs, about half the size of the large disc or styled from now on as the (mother Disc.
- (3) Seven smaller discs, below mother disc, and on different angles than the two larger discs, on left and right sides

There was Three performances, of these Discs The first being a fixed pattern. already. Then all of the smaller discs just dissappeared. leaving only the mother disc visible. none of these Discs disintegrated. They were there and then they were not there, all in the twinkling of an eye.

FACTS.

There was three phases of these discs. the first one being in a fixed pattern already. The large mother disc, about six inches in diameter Two smaller discs, about half the size of the mother disc. and one on the left one on the right side of the mother disc, very clear, and very plain. Then between and below the right and left discs beneath the mother disc, seven smaller ones about half the size of the right and left discs. one of the smaller discs was directly below the mother disc, and the other six scattered at different angles from the mother disc. . The mother Disc stayed in a fixed place, and the other ones just dissappeared. none of them disintegrated, first they were there and then they were gone.

The way I determined the positions, of this phenomena, was by their position above the Horizon.

Then I turned my eyes toward the mother disc, The two larger discs were emerging from the opposite sides of the mother disc, and going to the relative same positions as was in the first phase, the seven smaller discs, each came from different slots and formed the same position. and at the angles. as before. in the first phase. Forming no pattern of meaning that I could see or grasp. their color being this same deep soft black as before. even in the rays of the rising sun there was no change in their color or reflection of the sun rays.

THEORY.

(This is my only possible conclusion) Is it possible that these Discs could be a new method of photography unknown to us at this time. I remember some time ago, a Jet pilot chased one of these discs, and the faster he flew, the faster the disc speeded. The pilot was called off the chase. I believe that there could have been a barrier thrust between the jet and the disc, that might have added the speed of the Jet to the speed of the disc, to where it would make it impossible for the disc to be over taken.

The reason for the photography theory is the site and position of the discs should these discs have located at any of the rest of the points of the compass they would have been over the denser portion of San Antonio. As was the location of them they could view Lackland and a good portion of Kellyfield, which lies to the South east of and adjoins Lackland.

I hope these papers will help you in your department, if so you are welcome to them Without further claim or proffer of money.

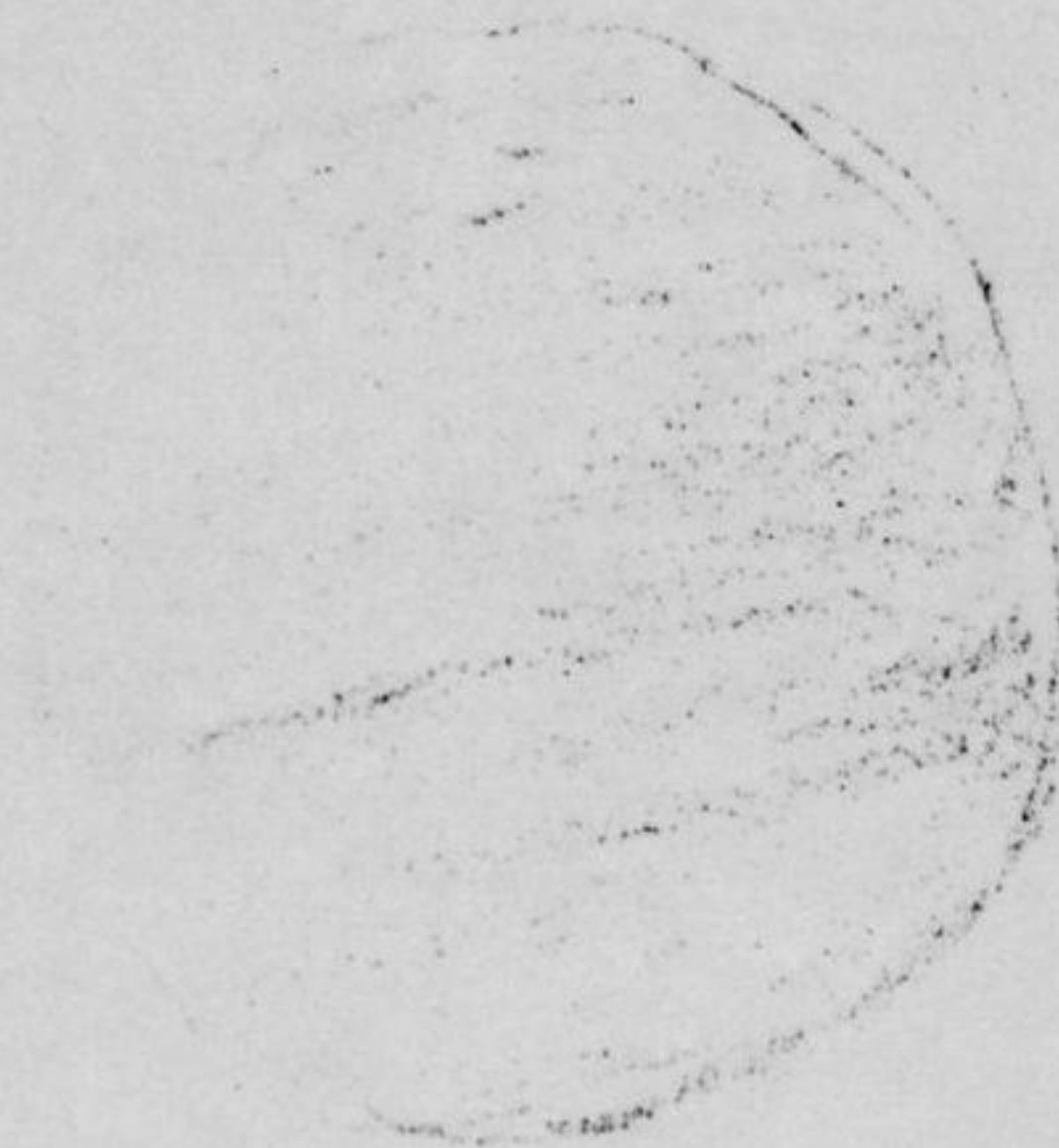
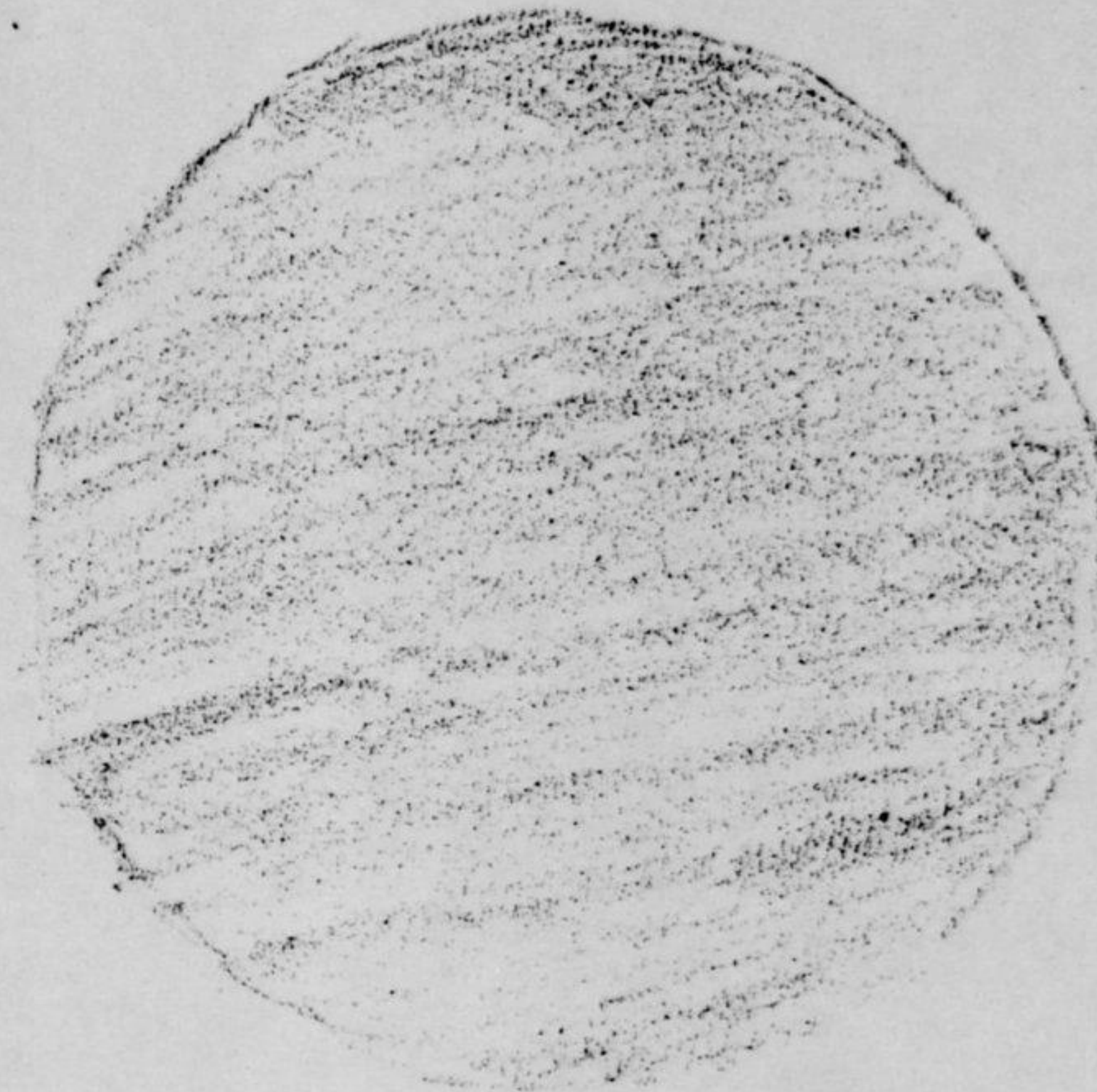

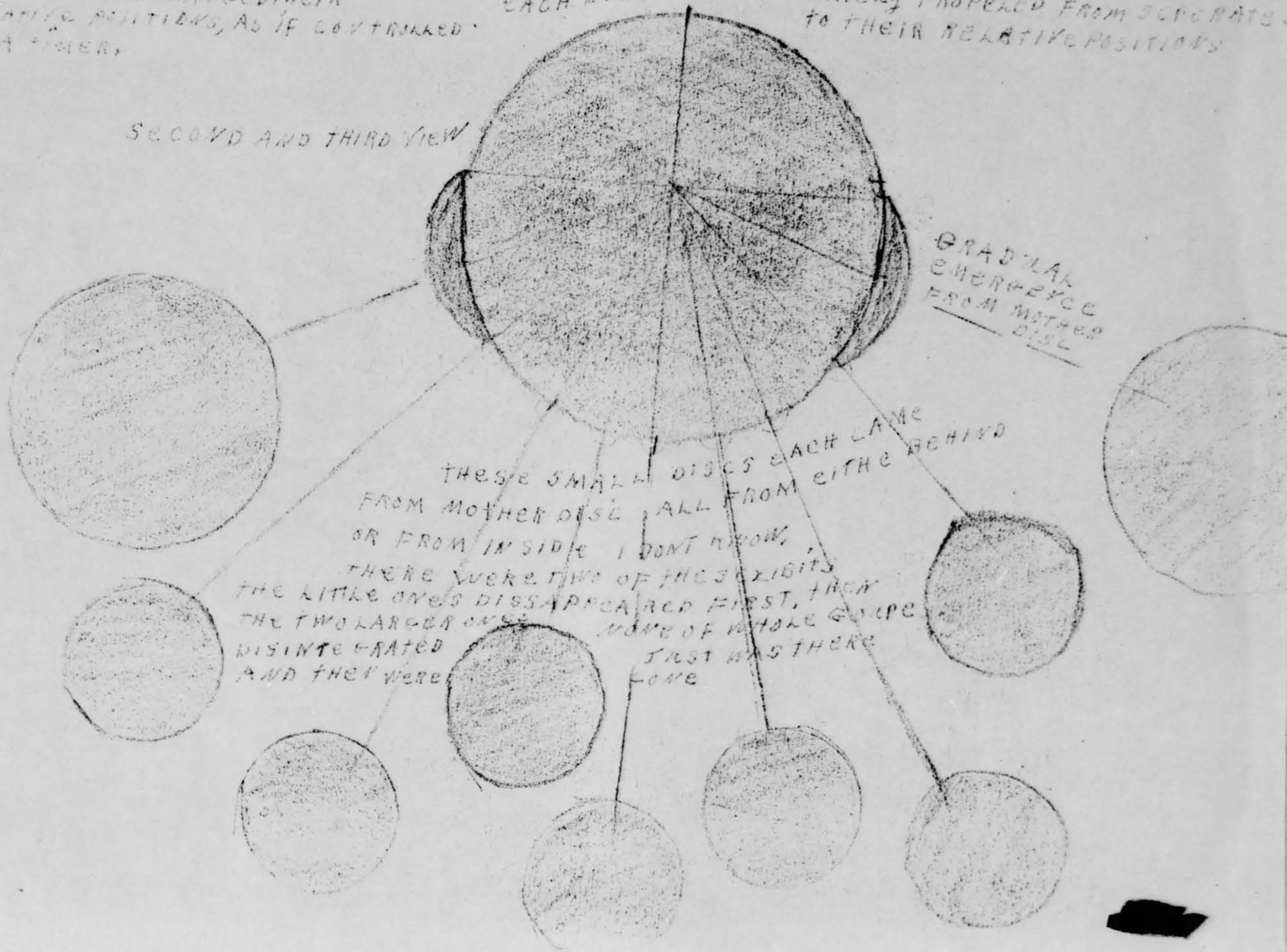
