This replies to your letter dated October 19, 1968, in which you reported that you and three others had seen an unidentified flying object (UFO).

Without additional information, we cannot offer an explanation of what you saw. However, if you will complete the inclosed questionnaire and mail it in the attached envelope, our technical people at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, will be able to investigate further and make an evaluation. We are also inclosing three additional questionnaires in the event that the others who saw the object care to complete them.

Should you ever see another UFO, please report it as soon as possible to the nearest Air Force base. Each base in the United States has an investigator of UFO's. He is in a better position to make an on-the-spot investigation, which usually results in a more accurate analysis.

In the meantime, you might be able to identify your sighting by looking at the categories of objects often reported as UFO's in the material we are sending.

Dear Sirs,

I am writing in regard to an unusual sighting by myself and three others on the campus of Mass. State Univ. I received your address from Dr. W. Hermer Van Buren, whom I have already written to concerning this matter.

Before relating the facts of the incident I must first tell you that Dr. Van Buren has already confirmed that it was not Apollo 7. He said that at that particular time Apollo 7 was over Capetown, South Africa (along with its booster)

On Saturday night, October 12, at approximately 7:00 p.m. the object was initially sighted. At first it was assumed to be an airplane but we soon discarded this idea. At an interval of precisely one second a bright white light was emitted. This light was very powerful and obliterated the faint light produced by reflection of stars.

Dr. De Sauri agrees that if the object had been a satellite orbiting the light would have resembled a star. However, the light had the effect of looking at a light bulb. That is, after the light blinked off we were temporarily blinded from seeing the stars.

At first the object was traveling in a southerly direction, then began a gradual right turn which eventually brought the object on an easterly course almost perpendicular to its original course. While this observation did not reveal anything unusual except for the intensity of the light, as the object approached nearer to a perpendicular crossing of our position we became aware of the fantastic speed the object was moving. Between each one second blink of light the object progressed ahead with a large gap between flashes of light.

The sky was pale, hardly overcast in the eastern sector but certainly clear in the Western sector. We were able to determine

The height of the object to be above the clouds. After changing course so as to head East, as described early in this section, caused the object to pass it past above the clouds in the eastern sector. However, the intensity of the light shone through all the clouds except the very dark ones, and we were able to follow the object until it was out of sight. Approximately 10 minutes.

Throughout this time there was never the first sound or noise. This led me to believe that the object was neither jet nor supersonic operated. The intensity of the light also eliminated the thought of an airplane.

One more phenomena of the light was that it appeared to depict the entire size of the object. In other words, through repeated flashings we were never ever able to determine any additional structure attached to the light. It seemed as though the entire object was composed of the light.
